#### No Maths and Science rewrites for matriculants

government is now considering The broadening this and asking consumers to pay TV license for streaming services such as Netflix, showmax and others. "The Democratic Alliance (DA) has launched a petition to oppose the government's plans to extend license fees to streaming services such as Netflix, Showmax, and others. In the Draft White Paper on Audio and Audio-visual Content Services Policy Framework: A New Vision for South Africa 2020, the Department of Communications and Digital Technologies proposes broadening the definition of a "broadcasting service" to include online broadcasting services. This means that South Africans will have to cough up more money for watching "broadcasting services", regardless of whether it's on a TV, a computer or a phone. The law currently states that consumers must pay a TV licence fee for viewing "broadcasting services", which includes subscription services like DSTV. When you buy a TV, regardless of whether you watch SABC content on it or not, you must pay a licence fee for any "broadcasting services." In this sense, "broadcasting service" is limited to content viewed on a TV set.

The DA strongly opposes the license fee on streaming services. This is effectively an underhanded attempt by the ANC to force South Africans to use their hard-earned money to bail out the SABC.

It is ridiculous that the government wants to punish South Africans to use their hard-earned money to sustain an entity which the ANC, through their incessant political interference, destroyed. The DA appreciates the importance of the SABC as a public broadcaster. But the broadcaster must find creative ways to selfsustain and break-even without making South Africans fork out any more money." said the DA in a statement issued recently.

# "Please help us help Logan grow into the little boy that he's meant to be"

RUSTENBURG HERALD -RUSTENBURG - "My name is Wilmie Slabbert and I am the mother of Logan Guillaume Slabbert. He will be 1 year old on 27 December 2020. We are from Windhoek Namibia, however Logan was born in Cape Town and his grandfather, Mr Gerry Slabbert is currently staying in Rustenburg.

This is our story: When we found out we were having a little boy, we were ecstatic. However, at our 20 week appointment our Dr noticed something is wrong with his little heart. After a second and third opinion it was decided I should head to Cape Town to see a specialist. At 24 weeks pregnant our little man was diagnosed with Tetralogy of Fallot - Tetralogy of Fallot is a combination of four congenital abnormalities. The four defects include a ventricular septal defect (VSD), pulmonary valve stenosis, a misplaced aorta and a thickened right ventricular wall (right ventricular hypertrophy). This was the biggest shock of our lives leaving us devastated. It was then decided I should give birth in Cape Town at Christian Barnard Memorial. Our little boy was born on 27 December 2019 at Christian Barnard Memorial in Cape Town via emergency c-section at 38 weeks and extremely small at 2.4kgs. However at birth it was not only his little heart that was an emergency, the doctors noticed numerous physical medical problems that could not have been seen on any scans. He struggled to breath and had to be incubated. He had an anal malformation meaning he could not poop. At 1 day old they had to give him his first operation, a Colostomy, a bag on his stomach where his poop can go. A few weeks later he got the Tracheostomy so that the intubation tube could be removed. This is the little tube you can see in his throat. Not too long after this he received his first heart operation, the actual and primary reason that we were there. A Blalock shunt was inserted. After all this our little hero was still growing each and every day. He was so strong and resilient, even after all the doubts that the Doctors had. He was on a ventilator for a while and then

finally was able to breath on his own and go on just oxygen. After almost 3 months in the PICU in Cape Town we could finally come home on 10 March 2020. All these operations were however just temporary fixes until he is big enough to have the actual corrective surgeries. He is still on oxygen due to his heart condition and his lungs that are still a bit weak but looking past all this he is the happiest little boy ever. We are returning to Cape Town January 2021 for follow up corrective operations like his heart which is open heart surgery and colostomy reversal. We are still paying off medical bills from the first hospital stay and surgeries and due the fact that the hospital and doctors are all above medical aid tariffs leaving us with enormous co-payments. Logan is also still on a lot of medications that are also extremely expensive. And then also with our new journey around the corner again and new medical bills on top of the existing ones. We will do anything for our little boy, please help us help Logan grow into the little boy that he is meant to be".

# Cyclists - help them to come home safely

RUSTENBURG HERALD - RUSTENBURG - The festive season is here which usually adhering to the COVID-19 regulations which means an increase of the number of cyclists on the road. Cycling is one of the most affordable means of transport and great for exercising and is becoming more and more popular so there are many more cyclists out there especially at this time of the year. Emphasizing that "Cycling is part of the solution" as a mode of transport in South Africa, the PPA "Stay Wider of the Rider" campaign is reminding drivers and cyclists to take preventative steps to avoid collisions. In South Africa, bicycles are considered legal vehicles and are bound to the same laws, and courtesy as motor vehicles.

"The road is a shared space where all road users have rights and responsibilities" explains chairman of the Pedal Power Association, Steve Hayward.

For drivers, the key message is "give cyclists space when passing them or wait until you can do so safely".

Remembering that your car is a heavy piece of machinery and that cyclists (and pedestrians) are extremely vulnerable motorists can avoid injuring cyclists by practising the following:

Always be aware of your surroundings and be on the lookout for cyclists;

· When passing a cyclist, please give them at least a one metre berth, but preferably as much room as you would give a car. Cyclists cannot keep too far left as it becomes dangerous and they may need to swerve to avoid hazards in the road. Always anticipate that there may be a pothole, an oily or wet patch, glass or some other obstruction in the cyclist's path that you cannot see;

· If you are towing a trailer or caravan remember to give extra room when passing a cyclist and don't cut in too early:

· Don't drive too closely behind a cyclist you may not be able to stop in time if they come off their bike or do something abruptly. If the road is narrow and you want to pass, rather slow down and wait until there is enough room;

· Be particularly vigilant if you see there are children riding bikes - they may do something unexpected:

· When making a left turn, remember that there could be a cyclist coming up behind you who is proceeding straight. Double check that there are no cyclists before making the turn; · If you are turning right and there is a cyclist

approaching you in the opposite lane do not underestimate their speed. A cyclist can ride at up to 40km per hour so rather pause a moment and let the cyclist through safely:

· Avoid "dooring" a cyclist - check behind you before opening your door to exit your car. Also remind your children to do the same;

· Do not park or stop in cycle lanes, it puts cyclists in even more danger when they move around your vehicle:

· Drive slowly in restricted or low visibility conditions - remember that a cyclist could be around the next corner, so in residential areas, on rural roads or those with limited sight distance or low visibility slow down when you are not sure what is on the other side.

"With the spike of COVID cases along the Garden Route and Nelson Mandela Bay as well as areas in the Cape Metro. the Pedal Power Association encourages cyclists - novices and experts alike - to hit the trails and roads practising social distancing and adhering to wearing a mask or buff thus becoming part of the solution not the problem," says Hayward. "Besides



are mandatory in South Africa under level 1 lockdown regulations, we also wish to appeal to cyclists to wear high visibility clothing and use bike lights at all times," explains Hayward. "The PPA is very concerned about the high percentage of hit and run accidents caused by intoxicated drivers on the roads in the early hours of the morning, so we appeal to cyclists to be vigilant at all times and even more so when approaching areas which have been identified as accident hot spots," says Hayward. For cyclists we recommend the following safe cycling tips:

Be visible: Wear bright clothes so that drivers can see you - anything neon is great during the davtime. It's best to avoid biking before sunrise and after sunset, but if you do go for a ride after dark, be sure to wear reflective gear and have lights. When turning, be sure to signal to drivers and make eye contact when possible. Cycle in a straight, predictable line so that you don't take any drivers by surprise.

Check your bike: Before you head out, check your tyre pressure, lights and brakes to make sure everything is in order. This way there is less of a chance of some sort of malfunction that could jeopardize your safety.

· Ride in groups if possible: More and more cases of muggings and bike jacking are reported to the PPA daily. Try to slot in with a local Whatsapp group for your own safety.

Be extra vigilant when riding in the early hours of the morning as records show that most fatal incidents happen between 04:00 and 07:00 when drivers head home from a night out.

· Always wear an ID bracelet when you are out cycling. Most of these have an emergency number to call should you need medical attention. It also makes it easier to contact your next of kin should you be out riding alone.

· Do not use your cell phone whilst riding, stop to take a call or make a call in an area safe to do so.

Report accidents and muggings to the SAPS and the PPA.

· Avoid hotspot areas early in the morning. · Always stay aware of your surroundings, riding with earphones is illegal and detracts from you being aware of what is happening around you. "While encouraging cycling for recreational and commuting purposes, the safety of all cyclists is our main concern," says Hayward. "By being proactive and sharing the road responsibly cyclists and drivers can all enjoy the great outdoors during the coming festive season. Courtesy comes free and leaves both parties feeling better. Acknowledge each other on the road and thank courteous behaviour," Hayward concluded.

**RUSTENBURG HERALD - RUSTENBURG - For the** first time in 800 years, people on Earth will be able to see the "Christmas star" in the night sky.

This December, South Africans will be able to see the rare "Christmas star" with their naked eyes. The last time the phenomenon was visible from Earth was in 1226 AD, the medieval Kingdom of Mapungubwe was still thriving in the north of South Africa, in Europe the bloody Crusades began and Louis VIII, the Lion, King of France dies at 39.

But what is this "Christmas star"? Although it is called the "Christmas star", it is not actually a star shining brightly in the night sky. Astronomers refer to the celestial phenomenon as the "Great Conjunction", an expert astronomer explains. Although the two planets align every 20 years, not all conjunctions are equal. It is said that the last time they appeared this close was in 1623 AD, but they would have appeared very close to the Sun, and so very difficult for people to see. This year, like in 1226 AD, it is not near the Sun, so people can actually witness the Christmas star. By chance, the conjunction also happens to coincide with the summer solstice - the longest day in the southern hemisphere, which occurs on 21 December. The best time to see it, the astronomer advises, is just after sunset. How to spot it: If you look to the west, you'll see two bright objects, two of the brightest things in the sky. It is already possible to see them, and over the next two weeks they will draw even closer together - although they will never actually overlap. This year, the two planets are so close to Earth that you can see them with the naked eye. But, if you happen to have a decent pair of binoculars or a telescope, it is possible to observe the rings on Saturn and some of the moons that orbit Jupiter.

Make the effort to go out to look at it; the next Great Conjunction will occur only in 2080 again.

There are directives that we have sent to schools since the beginning of the pandemic about school trips," North West Education MEC Mmaphefo Matsemela said on Saturday. Matsemela emphasized that all school trips must be authorized by the head of the department. According to information

received, a group of 42 learners, travelling in three minibus taxis, attended a matric farewell function in Brits on Friday. On their way back home, one of the taxi drivers allegedly lost control of the minibus he was driving and the vehicle overturned, claiming the lives of Ikageng Nkosi (18), Tshepiso Moagi (21) and Amogelang Diphoko (20). Eleven others were injured and admitted to a hospital in Brits. Earlier this week it was reported that they were all in stable condition.



# **Celebrated author dies**

RUSTENBURG HERALD - TRURO - John le Carre, the celebrated author famous for his spy novels, has died at the age of 89 after a short illness. Among his 25 books were the best-sellers Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy and The Spy Who Came In From The Cold. Both were adapted for the screen, gaining the writer a wider audience.

Literary agency Curtis Brown said the author and former spy, real name David Cornwell, died on Saturday evening after a short illness which was not related to Covid-19. A statement shared on behalf of his family said: "It is with great sadness that we must confirm that David Cornwell - John le Carre - passed away from pneumonia last Saturday night after a short battle with the illness. "David is survived by his beloved wife of almost 50 years, Jane, and his sons Nicholas, Timothy, Stephen and Simon. "We all grieve deeply his passing. Our thanks go to the wonderful NHS team at the Royal Cornwall Hospital in Truro for the care and compassion that he was shown throughout his stay. We know they share our sadness." Cornwell, who worked for both the Security Service (MI5) and the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6), wrote a number of international best-selling espionage novels. His best-known works also included The Night Manager and The Constant Gardener. "John le Carre was an undisputed giant of English literature," Jonny Geller, chief executive of the Curtis Brown Group, said in a statement. "He defined the Cold War era and fearlessly spoke truth to power in the decades that followed." Mr Geller added: "I represented David for almost 15 years. I have lost a mentor, an inspiration and most importantly, a friend. We will not see his like again." In a tribute on Twitter, author Stephen King described him as "a literary giant and a humanitarian spirit".



# 'N SUKSESVERHAAL IN PILANESBERG Rain groet haar dogters

#### RUSTENBURG HERALD - RUSTENBURG – 'n Suksesverhaal het vroeër dié maand in die Pilanesberg Natuurreservaat afgespeel toe twee vroulike jagluiperds suksesvol gekrat is en na hulle nuwe tuiste in die Majete Nasionale Park in Malawi vertrek het.

Dit klink maklik, maar agter die skerms is dit 'n reusetaak. Rain, die ma van die twee jagluiperds wat Malawi toe 'emigreer', is ook in 2014 in die Pilanesberg Natuurreservaat hervestig en sy het floreer. Sommer gou het sy met 'n werpsel van vier welpies gespog en talle werpsels daarna groot gemaak. Maar terug by die 'emigrante'. Dr. Gerhardus Scheepers, 'n veearts van Brits wat aktief in wildbewaring in Suid-Afrika betrokke is, vertel dat dit noodsaaklik is om die genepoel gesond te hou en inteling te voorkom, daarom dat die vroulike jagluiperds na Malawi gaan. Die jagluiperdpopulasie word deur die Endangered Wildlife Trust (EWT) in Suid-Afrika beheer en hulle bepaal waarheen dié bedreigde diere plaaslik en internasionaal geskuif kan word om hulle voortbestaan te verseker. "Dit is hartseer dat hulle vertrek, maar ook positief, want ons is opgewonde om hulle vordering hier in Afrika dop te hou," sê dr. Scheepers en vervolg, "nadat hulle geïdentifiseer is, het ons hulle in September gepyl en radiohalsbande aangesit. Op 8 Desember moes hulle al die inentings kry, ontwurm word en ook teen vlooibesmetting behandel word en die nodige CITES-dokumentasie (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora) moes natuurlik in plek wees. 



At the same time however, so-called super spreaders such as huge shopping centers, malls and the like are allowed to continue as usual, which seems somewhat counter-productive. Has the virus not clearly demonstrated for the second time that the country's economy will suffer for as long as Covid-19 is not absolutely defeated? Perhaps a more balanced approach would be to once again restrict business hours from Mondays to Fridays between 09:00 and 17:00 and to allow holiday-makers to visit our beaches over weekends?

During busy periods, Bakwena will ensure that all lanes at their plazas are open in the peak direction. Maintain a safe following distance of at least three seconds or more between yourself and the vehicle in front of you. This distance should be increased at times of low visibility and when the road is wet. Stick to the speed limit.

Do not drink and drive, this is one of the leading major causes contributing to crashes in South Africa.

Avoid texting and driving, leave the texting in the hands of your passengers.



The CJP is a bridge between schools and the criminal justice system departments and seeks to dispel myths learners may hold about criminal justice by exposing participants to facilities such as police stations, courts and correctional facilities through experiential learning. So far, 283 learners have been exposed to the CJP in North West while nationally, 73 schools and about 5000 learners have been reached. "The major benefit of this programme is improved learner behavior, both at school and at home. Diverse topics debated during the training include social aspects such as drug and alcohol abuse, gangsterism, rape, bullying and violence. These problems are prevalent at the selected schools," said General (retired) Riah Phiyega, CEO of Safer South Africa Foundation.
