BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Two men were left injured on Friday morning (21 February) when the bakkie they were travelling in overturned off the R104 near Buffelspoort.

According to Russel Meiring, ER24 spokesperson, paramedics, along with other services, arrived on the scene to find the bakkie on its roof against several trees. One man was found walking around on the scene while a second man was found trapped inside the driver's side. Assessments showed that

both men had sustained moderate injuries. Medics carefully extricated the man from the vehicle and treated them both. Once treated, the men were transported to nearby hospitals for further care. One person sustained serious injuries and another sustained moderate injuries during a headon-collision between a truck and a bakkie along the Donkerhoek Road in Rustenburg on Saturday (22 February). New minimum wages announced

SA's minimum wage is increasing on 1 March 2020

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - This will be the first increase since 2019. The minimum hourly wage and the special wages for some categories of work, will all increase by just about 3.8%, approximately in line with inflation at the moment counting from when the wages were first introduced.

Unions were outraged at a previous recommendation of 5% increases, pointing out that the minimum wages introduced in 2019 were agreed in 2017 and are now much

The new prescribed minimum wages for domestic workers and farm workers for 2020 are as follows:

The minimum wage in South Africa will increase by roughly 3.8% from 1 March 2020 – roughly in line with annual inflation, but far below the level unions had wanted. The new national minimum wage will be set at R20.76 per hour, employment and labour minister Thulas Nxesi decreed in a notice published last Monday. That is an increase of exactly 3.8% on the previous R20, which came into effect on 1 January 2019.

As with the original minimum wage, certain categories of workers have lower minimum salaries. Because all of those wages are set to the nearest cent without fractions, the increases for those sectors range between 3.77% and 3.818%. In December, the latest month available, annual consumer inflation was at 4%, up from the rate of 3.6% in November. Inflation expectations for

2019 are currently at around 4.5%.

Unions had sought an increase of at least 12.5% in the minimum wage this year – on the basis that it has not increased for more than two years. Though the minimum wage was implemented in January 2019, the law that brought it into being was approved in November 2017, the R20-per-hour number was set at the time. The underlying amounts were actually agreed in March 2017, though, three years before the new increases will come into effect. In a joint statement in January, union groups Cosatu, Fedusa, and Nactu described a recommendation of a 5% across-the-board increase by the National Minimum Wage Commission as "shocking and callous".

The new minimum wage that comes into effect on 1 March 2020 are:

- # For work not covered by a special determination: R20.76 per
- For domestic workers: R15.57 per hour.
- For contract cleaning staff: between R20.83 and R22.84 per hour, depending on the geographic area.
- For farm workers: R18.68 per
- For workers in government's expanded public works programme: R11.42 per hour.



Fuel price decrease

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Data from the Central Energy Fund shows that motorist could be in for a drop in the petrol and diesel prices next week.

According to these indications, petrol is currently showing a drop of between 14 and 25 cents a litre, diesel around 55 cents, and illuminating paraffin 66 cents.

Steady declines in international oil prices have got the upper hand over a weakening rand, setting the stage for fuel price reductions at month end, said the

Automobile Association (AA), commenting on the data.

The AA said oil's pullback since the start of the month has been quite marked. "In the case of illuminating paraffin, the landed price of the fuel dropped by over 90 cents in two weeks. Similar positive effects have been noted on the other main liquid fuels." However,

the rand has weakened substantially over the same period, with the moving average against the US dollar slipping from just over R14.30 to R14.85. "This reflects underlying weak economic sentiment in South Africa, and we share the view of many commentators that further weakening is likely," the association said. Fortunately, the rand's poor showing was

not enough to take the shine off the reduction in the landed prices of fuel. The AA said the trends from now to month-end would determine whether fuel prices could cling on to these gains. "If the rand continues to slip, we might see some reversal of the trend," it

Armed robbery at Heystek Street

The case was then assigned to Warrant Officer Thembela Molete who through intensive investigation managed to secure a speedy conviction.




NW Speaker also to blame for violence at SOPA?

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Democratic Alliance (DA) in North West has taken note of the announcement made by Speaker in the North West Provincial Legislature (NWPL), Sussana Dantjie, that an investigation into the violence that erupted during the State of the Province Address (SOPA) LAST Friday will be conducted and reported on within seven days.

The Speaker's decision emanated from the scuffle between Members of the NWPL and security officers after some members were forcefully removed from the SOPA proceedings - upon her instruction. "We condemn any form of violence or verbal abuse in the strongest terms and hereby emphatically state that this investigation should also consider the Speaker's role in the escalation of the matter, as she instructed security officers and the police to remove the MPLs. If the Speaker has any integrity, she will submit herself to this investigation." The DA said that they will therefore call for an independent investigation that will be conducted on the Speaker, security, police and all other individuals that contributed to the unwarranted uproar and report directly to the Legislature. "The DA will further write to the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, to present a plan in providing administrative laws governing the behaviour of staff and security with particular emphasis on the biased behaviour of the Speaker during important sittings," said Winston Rabotapi, DA NW caucus leader in the Provincial Legislature.




