BONUS – RUSTENBURG – Two men were left injured on Friday morning (21 February) when the bakkie they were travelling in overturned off the R104 near Buffelspoort.

According to Russel Meiring, ER24 spokesperson, paramedics, along with other services, arrived on the scene to find the bakkie on its roof against several trees. One man was found walking around on the scene while a second man was found trapped inside the driver’s side. Assessments showed that both men had sustained moderate injuries. Medics carefully extricated the man from the vehicle and treated them both. Once treated, the men were transported to nearby hospitals for further care. The details surrounding this incident are not yet known but local authorities were on the scene for further investigations.



One person sustained serious injuries and another sustained moderate injuries during a head-on-collision between a truck and a bakkie along the Donkerhoek Road in Rustenburg on Saturday (22 February). According to ER24 Spokesperson, Werner Vermaak, at approximately 20:00, paramedics arrived on the scene where they found the two mangled vehicles. The driver of the truck sustained serious injuries and was rescued from the vehicle, while the driver of the bakkie sustained moderate injuries and was treated on the scene. Both patients were later transported to a nearby hospital for further care. The exact circumstances surrounding the collision were still being investigated by our time of going to press.

Father and son injured in collision

BONUS - RUSTENBURG – A man and his 7-year-old son were left injured when their bakkie and truck collided on the R24 in Rustenburg on Thursday evening (20 February).

According to information received from Russel Meiring, ER24 Spokesperson, paramedics arrived on the scene at 18:15 to find a truck and a bakkie in the middle of the road. On closer inspection, medics found that the man was trapped inside the bakkie while the child was seated next to him. Both patients were found with moderate injuries. Rescue medics carefully extricated the man and thereafter treated both patients. Once treated, the patients were transported to a private hospital for further care. The truck driver fortunately escaped injury. Local authorities were on the scene for further investigations.

New minimum wages announced

SA’s minimum wage is increasing on 1 March 2020

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - This will be the first increase since 2019. The minimum hourly wage and the special wages for some categories of work, will all increase by just about 3.8%, approximately in line with inflation at the moment counting from when the wages were first introduced.

Unions were outraged at a previous recommendation of 5% increases, pointing out that the minimum wages introduced in 2019 were agreed in 2017 and are now much eroded.

The new prescribed minimum wages for domestic workers and farm workers for 2020 are as follows:

The minimum wage in South Africa will increase by roughly 3.8% from 1 March 2020 – roughly in line with annual inflation, but far below the level unions had wanted. The new national minimum wage will be set at R20.76 per hour, employment and labour minister Thulas Nxesi decreed in a notice published last Monday. That is an increase of exactly 3.8% on the previous R20, which came into effect on 1 January 2019.

As with the original minimum wage, certain categories of workers have lower minimum

salaries. Because all of those wages are set to the nearest cent without fractions, the increases for those sectors range between 3.77% and 3.818%. In December, the latest month available, annual consumer inflation was at 4%, up from the rate of 3.6% in November. Inflation expectations for 2019 are currently at around 4.5%.

Unions had sought an increase of at least 12.5% in the minimum wage this year – on the basis that it has not increased for more than two years. Though the minimum wage was implemented in January 2019, the law that brought it into being was approved in November

2017, the R20-per-hour number was set at the time. The underlying amounts were actually agreed in March 2017, though, three years before the new increases will come into effect. In a joint statement in January, union groups Cosatu, Fedusa, and Nactu described a recommendation of a 5% across-the-board increase by the National Minimum Wage Commission as “shocking and callous”.



The new minimum wage that comes into effect on 1 March 2020 are:

- # For work not covered by a special determination: R20.76 per hour.
- # For domestic workers: R15.57 per hour.
- # For contract cleaning staff: between R20.83 and R22.84 per hour, depending on the geographic area.
- # For farm workers: R18.68 per hour.
- # For workers in government’s expanded public works programme: R11.42 per hour.

Fuel price decrease

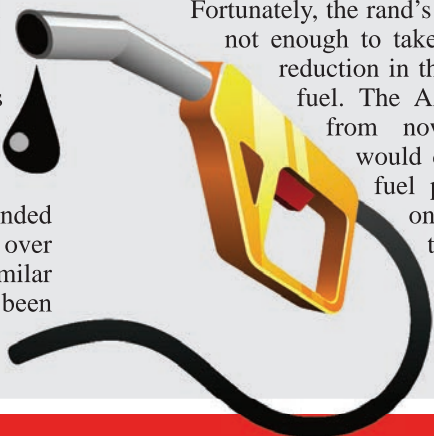
BONUS – RUSTENBURG - Data from the Central Energy Fund shows that motorist could be in for a drop in the petrol and diesel prices next week.

According to these indications, petrol is currently showing a drop of between 14 and 25 cents a litre, diesel around 55 cents, and illuminating paraffin 66 cents.

Steady declines in international oil prices have got the upper hand over a weakening rand, setting the stage for fuel price reductions at month end, said the Automobile Association (AA), commenting on the data.

The AA said oil’s pullback since the start of the month has been quite marked. “In the case of illuminating paraffin, the landed price of the fuel dropped by over 90 cents in two weeks. Similar positive effects have been noted on the other main liquid fuels.” However,

the rand has weakened substantially over the same period, with the moving average against the US dollar slipping from just over R14.30 to R14.85. “This reflects underlying weak economic sentiment in South Africa, and we share the view of many commentators that further weakening is likely,” the association said. Fortunately, the rand’s poor showing was not enough to take the shine off the reduction in the landed prices of fuel. The AA said the trends from now to month-end would determine whether fuel prices could cling on to these gains. “If the rand continues to slip, we might see some reversal of the trend,” it said.

Two offenders re-arrested after attempted escape

80-year-old in court for rape of minor

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - An 80-year-old elderly man appeared before the Brits Magistrates Court on Monday (17 February) for the alleged rape of a 7-year-old girl.

The court appearance stems from his apprehension on Saturday (15 February) at about 15:00 in Geluk farming area, on the outskirts of Brits.

According to Captain Sam Tselanyane, provincial police spokesperson it is alleged that the suspect went to the nearby shop accompanied by the victim who is the grandchild of his girlfriend on Saturday (15 February). Furthermore, the mother of the child went looking for them as she felt that they are taking too long to return home.

She saw that they were on their way home and close by, she then went back inside the house.

In a dramatic turn of events, it is alleged that while inside the house, she

decided to go and check on them again as they were taking longer than expected to enter the house.

It is further alleged that both the suspect and the child were nowhere to be found. She allegedly searched and found both of them under a tree in the bushes, with the child allegedly half naked.

The mother allegedly screamed for community members to come to her rescue and thereafter the police were alerted.

The suspect was immediately arrested and charged with rape.

He was remanded in custody and was expected to reappear before the same court on Tuesday (25 February) for formal bail application.

Armed robbery at Heystek Street

BONUS - RUSTENBURG – A business man was blocked and robbed of an undisclosed amount of money and other valuables at Heystek Street in Rustenburg on Wednesday morning (19 February).

According to information received from Rustenburg police spokesperson Sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, while the owner of one of the shops in Heystek street was about to leave his business premises allegedly to bank, a blue Opel Astra blocked him, two men then came from both sides, armed with pistols demanded him to open the doors.

One of the assailants broke open the window, two other assailants joined them, ransacked the car and took money and other belongings and fled the scene.

According to Mokgadi all in all there were five suspects, and the registration number of the vehicle that they were using is: CBC 715 GP.

No shots were fired and no injuries were reported and the police are investigating a case of armed robbery.

Smallholding robber sentenced

BONUS – RUSTENBURG – Ishmael Refilwe Seitlamo (26) was sentenced by the Rustenburg Magistrates Court to a three year direct imprisonment on Tuesday (11 February) for robbery.

According to Sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, police spokesperson in Rustenburg, Seitlamo's arrest came after he robbed a small holding (Plot 164) in Waterkloof late last year.

Information available at this stage suggests that Seitlamo gained entry to the premises through the roof while it appeared as if no one was there.

He took clothes and an undisclosed amount of cash but while inside the premises one of the residents came back and caught him red handed in the act and handed him to the police.

The case was then assigned to Warrant Officer Thembele Molete who through intensive investigation managed to secure a speedy conviction.

Brigadier Modise and station management applauded Warrant Officer Molete for the sterling work done is securing the sentence. She reiterated that crimes on small holdings will not be tolerated and the police will leave no stone unturned in bringing perpetrators to book.

Marikana bags R1 billion



BONUS -RUSTENBURG - The precious metals producer Sibanye-Stillwater had an eventful 2019, which included a damaging gold strike and the acquisition of Lonmin - and it is, in part due to Lonmin's former Marikana mine - that Sibanye has reason to celebrate now.

Sibanye posted a profit of R432-million in 2019, a nice bounce from a loss of R2.5-billion in 2018, the company said on Wednesday (19 February). That bounce would have been higher were it not for a violent strike at its gold operations by members of the Association of Mineworkers and Construction Union (Amcu), which started in

November 2018 and ended in April 2019, but overall, the company had a solid performance over the course of an eventful year, with rising prices underpinning the swing back to profit - a trend that has been lifting overall industry earnings. The average rand gold price the company received rose 21%, which helped to offset the impact of the strike, which pushed the company's bullion production down 21%. Platinum group metal (PGM) prices, notably for palladium and rhodium, have been shooting the lights out on supply concerns.

Both metals are key components of the emissions-capping catalysts used in petrol and hybrid engines, and tighter standards are driving demand.

Sibanye is well-placed in this regard, with palladium accounting for 42% of its PGM

production. "The year in review was a tale of two halves, with the financial performance in H2 2019 in stark contrast to H1 2019, which was significantly impacted by strike action at the SA gold operations and other operational disruptions," the company said in a statement. One surprise was the performance of the Marikana mine - it generated over R1-billion in profit for the last six months of 2019. "It generated a profit because we are in such a different economic environment," Sibanye CEO Neal Froneman said during the presentation of the results at the JSE. "The basket price for Marikana when we bought it has gone from R13,000 an ounce to R30,000 an ounce," he added, referring to the price that the combined basket of PGMs, primarily platinum, palladium and rhodium, fetch per ounce. About 30% of Marikana's production is palladium.

Lonmin must be spinning in its grave - it succumbed among other things to depressed prices and was finally pronounced dead just as prices were starting to surge. The pay-dirt can be seen in the payback. Froneman said that Marikana would repay its all-share acquisition price in a year - an astonishing return on investment.

"Marikana has one-year payback. It will pay back its purchase price of R4-billion in one year.

It's probably the best acquisition we've done in terms of payback period," said Froneman. There was also a restructuring there that saw 1,142 employees retrenched, while 1,700 contractors lost their jobs - fewer cuts than were initially anticipated. Froneman said during his results presentation that Sibanye are seriously committed to reestablishing their dividend.

That could potentially come in August 2020, when the company will report its interim 2020 financials.

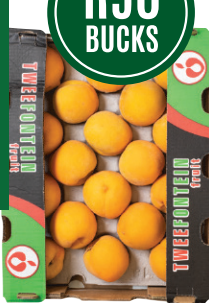

NW Speaker also to blame for violence at SOPA?

BONUS – RUSTENBURG - The Democratic Alliance (DA) in North West has taken note of the announcement made by Speaker in the North West Provincial Legislature (NWPL), Sussana Dantjie, that an investigation into the violence that erupted during the State of the Province Address (SOPA) LAST Friday will be conducted and reported on within seven days.

The Speaker's decision emanated from the scuffle between Members of the NWPL and security officers after some members were forcefully removed from the SOPA proceedings - upon her instruction. "We condemn any form of violence or verbal abuse in the strongest terms and hereby emphatically state that this investigation should also consider the Speaker's role in the escalation of the matter, as she instructed security officers and the police to remove the MPLs. If the Speaker has any integrity, she will submit herself to this investigation." The DA said that they will therefore call for an independent investigation that will be conducted on the Speaker, security, police and all other individuals that contributed to the unwarranted uproar and report directly to the Legislature. "The DA will further write to the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, to present a plan in providing administrative laws governing the behaviour of staff and security with particular emphasis on the biased behaviour of the Speaker during important sittings," said Winston Rabotapi, DA NW caucus leader in the Provincial Legislature.

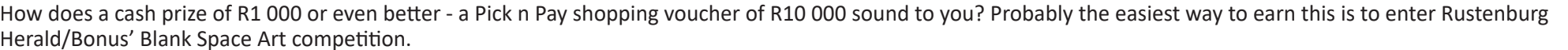
