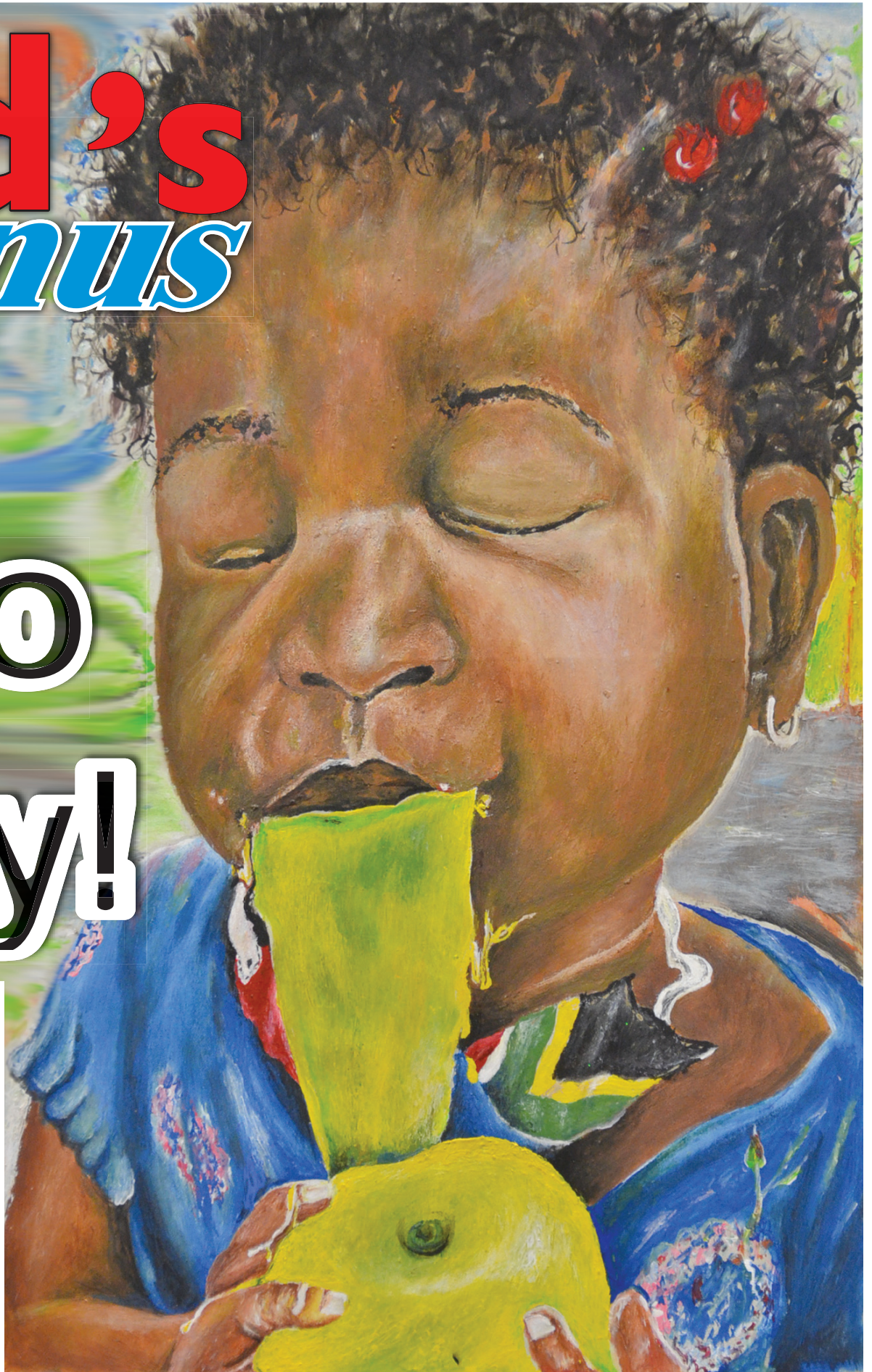

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - On Monday of this week it was back to school for most learners in the country. Some of the grades haven't been in class since the end of March this year. According to the new regulations, those in grades R, 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 9, 10 and 11 will return as will pupils attending Schools of Skill in years 1, 2 and 3.

"The department is ready," said Basic Education Department spokesperson Elijah Mhlanga. "You will remember that schools have been running from 3 August with Grade 12s, the Grade 7s the following week and non-teaching staff returned on the 17th. "That means that the system has already been warm and people were already in offices to prepare for the number of grades that are returning."

There are concerns about a lack of resources and fears that the school's nutrition programme won't be ready to be rolled out. "With pupils returning now, it should be easier to handle the programme because the programme is a school-based programme," Mhlanga said. "With learners coming back, we should be able to feed all learners that benefit the programme." Education expert Professor Mary Metcalfe said what's important now is supporting all those involved in the education system.

"Teachers have got an enormous amount of work to do in planning their teaching," she said. "What they teach as school can be reinforced by what children will practice at home. Which means teachers will have to do much more preparation for supporting learning at home."



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Sun City, the biggest single tourism industry employer in the North West province, will officially reopen for business NEXT Wednesday.

This comes after South Africa relaxed Covid-19 restrictions to allow for inter-provincial leisure travel under alert Level 2. Sun International confirmed that the resort, which employs around 3300 people, will be opening its doors again on 2 September.

Sun International group COO for hospitality Graham Wood welcomed the move to Level 2, which was announced by President Cyril Ramaphosa on Saturday. Considering that "the large majority of Sun City's visitors are from outside North West" province, Wood is especially pleased that inter-provincial travel is now allowed. "To say we are delighted by this news would be an understatement. With inter-provincial travel restrictions lifted our tourist hotels and resorts such as Sun City Resort will finally be able to reopen." "It is unfortunate that the curfew could not be further relaxed, but we are grateful and relieved that our restaurants can again serve alcohol," he added.

Sun City was the only casino resort within Sun International's 12 gaming properties in South Africa that has not been trading since casinos were permitted to operate under Level 3 from July. Sun International is also yet to reopen its standalone hotel properties, which include the landmark Table Bay Hotel at Cape Town's V&A Waterfront and the Maslow Hotel in Sandton.

More reopenings on the cards

The group decided not to reopen these hotels or the expansive Sun City resort as it "did not making financial sense" due to the ban on inter-provincial and international travel under Level 3. With the former now allowed, the group is considering reopening these hotels as well, even though international tourism is still banned. "Most of our casinos have been operating since 1 July and customers have been very supportive, but the curfew has hurt our business by reducing operating hours at a time when numbers on the floor already had to be limited, so we are hopeful that this can be relaxed or lifted soon," Wood said. "Our current health and safety protocols will remain in place, and all Sun International properties now bear the World Travel and Tourism Council's safe stamp of approval, verifying that the Covid-19 health and safety protocols we have in place meet international benchmarks," he concluded.

Man dies in head-on collision



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A 36-year-old man died earlier this week after the Toyota Fortuner he was driving collided head-on with a VW Polo.

The accident happened on Tuesday evening (18 August) at around 23:30 about 10 km outside of Derby on the road to Rustenburg.

According to Rustenburg Police spokesperson, Capt Elsabé Augoustides, Elias Velapi Nduli was travelling from Ventersdorp to Midrand when his Fortuner collided with the VW Polo driven by Patrick Seropa (47). Seropa, from Thlabane West, was travelling to Ventersdorp when the accident occurred.

Nduli succumbed to his injuries on the scene, while Seropa was taken to a hospital in Rustenburg for treatment.

A case of culpable homicide is being investigated by the police.

Safari Gardens man caught with fake liquor

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A 45-year-old suspect appeared in the Rustenburg Magistrates Court on Thursday (20 August), after being arrested for counterfeit liquor, the illegal possession of a firearm, illegal possession of ammunition, and corruption.

The suspect, according to Brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone, provincial police spokesperson, was arrested after information was received and followed-up by members of Phokeng K9 unit. The incident occurred at about 21:00 on Tuesday (18 August) in Safari Gardens. During the operation, a pistol and 371 9mm ammunition were found in the house. In addition, liquor labels and various brands of suspected counterfeit liquor worth R380 000 were confiscated.

The suspect who could not account for the possession and liquor labels, attempted to bribe a police officer by offering him R6 000. However, he was charged for corruption. Investigation into the matter continues.

Beware of this "detective"

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - "I have managed to locate your stolen vehicle and I can go and fetch it for you. But I will need you to pay a few rand into my e-wallet account."

This is more or less what a scammer is telling people who have reported their vehicles stolen.

According to Capt Elsabé Augoustides, Rustenburg Police liaison officer, the "detective" claims he has information regarding the vehicle you have reported stolen and that he is able to go and retrieve your vehicle. And then he asks for money.

"Police will never ask you for money to complete an investigation," she emphasises. Capt Augoustides requests any person approached by this fake detectives to contact their nearest police station or the investigating officer handling their case.

BONUS – RUSTENBURG – Police here are investigating a case of culpable homicide after an eight-year-old girl died in a car crash on Wednesday evening (19 Augustus).

The accident happened just after 18:00 in Helen Joseph Drive, just after the Arend Drive turn-off. According to the police, the 29-year-old driver of the white Toyota bakkie claims that he felt the vehicle shudder just as he was crossing the bridge. He says after the shudder, he lost control of the vehicle. The bakkie rolled, slinging three passengers, a 39-year-old woman and her two children – eight –and three-years-old respectively – from the vehicle. The woman and three-year-old little boy sustained serious injuries, while the eight-year-old girl succumbed to her injuries.

According to eyewitness reports on social media, the bakkie travelled at high speed when the accident happened, allegedly ignoring the red traffic light at the crossing of Helen Joseph Drive and Arend Road. The drivers of other vehicles said they had to swerve desperately to avoid being hit by the bakkie before it rolled.

Accident at Olifantsnek claims well-known woman’s life

BONUS – RUSTENBURG – A collision just before 11:00 on Sunday claimed the life of a women well-known in agricultural circles.

The accident occurred on the R24 at a turn close to Olifantsnek. Annemarie van Niekerk succumbed to injuries she sustained when the Nissan NP200 she was a passenger in, collided with a six ton truck. Her husband, Koos, sustained serious injuries and was taken to a Rustenburg hospital. According to Rustenburg Police spokesperson, Capt Elsabé Augoustides, the truck driver, Samuel Mocheche, was on his way from Johannesburg to Rustenburg to collect possessions of Zimbabwean citizens wanting to return to Zimbabwe. Moments before the collision with the NP200, the truck, according to police, also bumped into a VW Tiguan travelling in the same direction as the truck. The driver of the Tiguan, Solomon Moseamedi, was not injured.

Man shoots and kills girlfriend, then kills himself

BONUS - KARLIENPARK - A normal Thursday afternoon in Reutlwile Informal Settlement, Karlien Park turned tragic when a man reportedly shot and killed his girlfriend and thereafter fatally injuring himself.

According to information that was received from Rustenburg Police Spokesperson, Sgt Ofentse Mokgadi, the couple died on the scene. The girlfriend, according to Mokgadi was 29-years-old. The couple’s young child was not injured. It is not yet clear what led to this horrific incident, but a case of murder, as well as an inquest are being investigated.

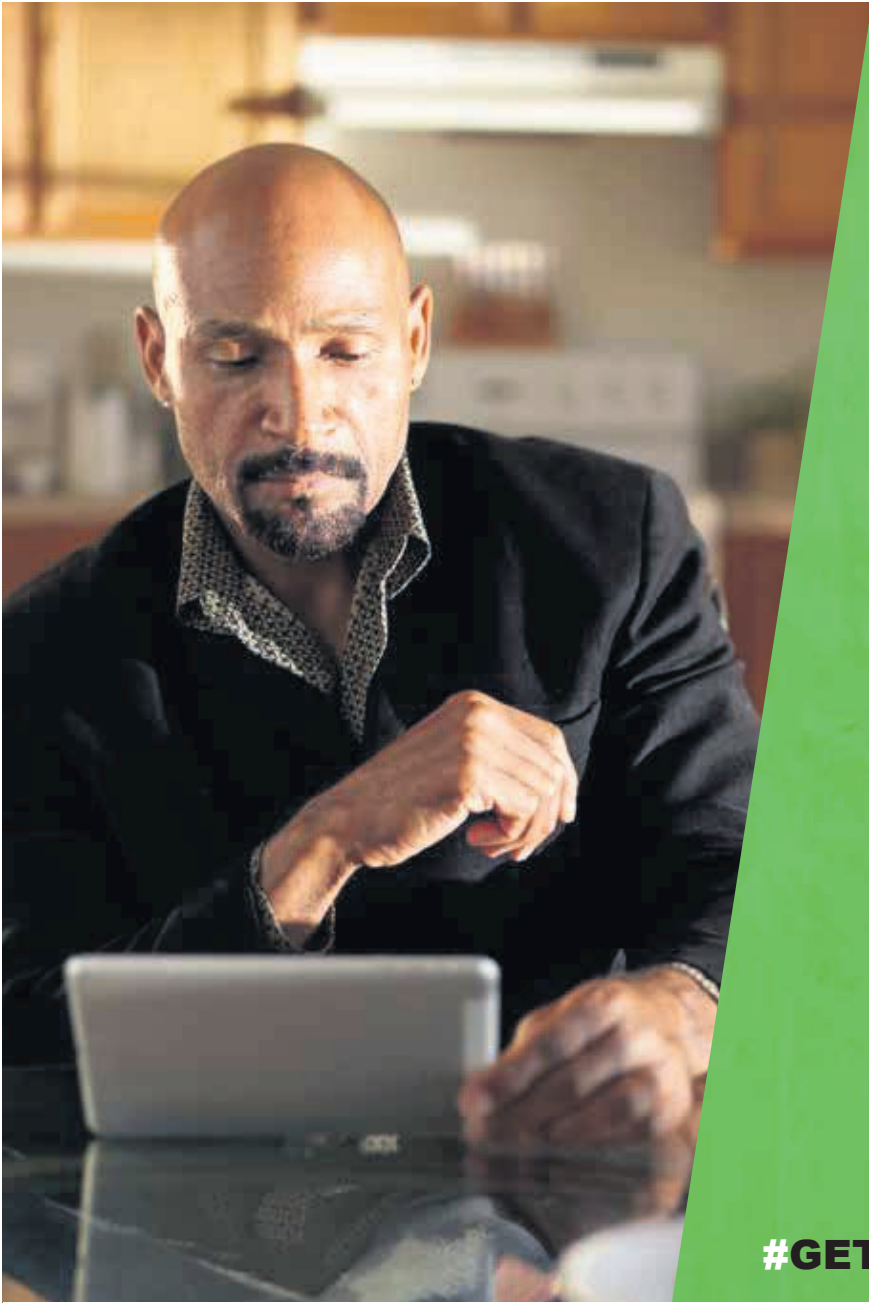
