R24 power outages receive attention

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - With a lot of residents having complained about power failures along the R24, the Rustenburg Local Municipality last week advised residents receiving electrical supply from the network along the R24 (Krugersdorp Road), that the reported frequent power supply cuts, have been receiving attention and Electrical Unit, continues to work on ensuring the stabilization of electricity supply to all the affected residents.

According to Mr David Magae, Rustenburg Local Municipality's spokesperson, to date the Electrical Unit has cut trees, which had been suspected to interfere with the power lines and subsequently replacing the insulators.

"Given the recurrence of the power outages on the aforementioned network, residents have been moved to an alternate supply line from a different Substation, while more work is being carried out to resolve the problem.

On Tuesday (7 July) the Electrical Unit removed all the illegal connections, which had been located on the network.

Residents along the R24 are advised of the intermittent power cuts throughout the day, as the team will be removing the illegal connections from the network.

Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital suspends visiting hours

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - In an effort to reduce the spread of coronavirus to personnel and patients, Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital has decided to suspend visiting hours to the hospital.

"This serves to inform members of the public that visiting hours will be suspended with effect from 13 July 2020, until further notice," a statement from the hospital said.

According Mr Kagiso Mbaiwa, Senior Communications Officer at Job Shimankana Tabane Hospital the decision to suspend visiting hours is to reduce cross infection of COVID-19 amongst patients, staff members and the public at large.

In instances where the condition of the patient warrants visitation of family members or next of kin, this should be arranged with the ward management.

The hospital apologised for the inconvenience this may cause.

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Two suspects aged 27 and 34 were arrested on Saturday (10 July) during a multi-prolonged operation by the Hawk's Serious Organised Crime Investigation, Crime Intelligence, K9, Flying Squad and Transnet officials, for tampering with essential infrastructure and theft of diesel worth approximately R480 000.

The suspects, according to Captain Tlangelani Rikhotso, Hawks spokesperson, were allegedly caught while stealing diesel at an underground pipeline site in Rustenburg by extracting the diesel from underground and pumping it into a fuel tanker.

Two suspects were immediately arrested while the third suspect managed to escape.

The suspects were expected to appear before the Rustenburg Magistrates Court on Monday (13 July).

The fuel tanker and other equipment used were seized for further investigations.

New lockdown regulations

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - While South Africans are still not allowed to visit family, taxis will be allowed to carry 100% passengers.

While you cannot drink a cup of coffee in the privacy of your home with your adult son or daughter, you can go to church, or a restaurant, with total strangers.

"These regulations are becoming more and more senseless," was the majority's reaction after President Ramaphosa's speech on Sunday night (12 July).

Of course South Africans are not happy about the reinstatement of the ban on alcohol sales - but to an extent people are more willing to accept that alcohol abuse is a contributing factor to hospitals not having space for patients with Covid-19 related illnesses.

"Alcohol related violence, motor vehicle accidents and domestic abuse has increased since the sale of alcohol was allowed," the President said in his address and explained that there was instances where hospitals had to turn away Covid-19 patients because alcohol related injuries were taking up

their capacity.

"But was the reason given for Lockdown not that the health institutions could get their ducks in a row before the real onslaught of Covid-19?" was a question that popped-up regularly on Social Media since last night. People had questions about the government's preparations if there is still not enough medical staff available.

There was also criticism about the President's statement that there are funerals held where a thousand people are in attendance. "Yes, this happens - at the funerals of government officials. When MEC Kgalekwe was laid to rest in Vryburg over the weekend, a massive tent was erected in the street to house all the people attending," one Social media commentator remarked.
