Level 4-rumour spreads panic

BONUS - RUSTENBURG HERALD - Reports on news channels over the weekend that the Northwest Province might be considering returning parts of the province to Level 4 lockdown has sparked panic on social media.

The province had only 38 confirmed Covid-19 cases a mere three weeks ago - but a sudden spike in cases saw a very quick rise to more than 400. The majority of the cases are in Rustenburg and Klerksdorp. The provincial command council is allegedly considering moving these two towns back to Level 4. "It is being discussed, but there is no indication at this stage as to which way - yes, or no - the decision will go," a

source said. Another added that the chances are slim that this will actually happen, as a lot of effort has gone into making it possible for schools to reopen. "Rather put Gauteng and the Western Cape back on Level 4, they have the real numbers that might justify such a decision. To put a whole province out of work again because of less than 400 active cases is madness," another source approached for comment said. However, no-one was willing to go on record before an official statement from the province was issued.

North West Health questioned about coal tender

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Democratic Alliance (DA) in North West has asked the provincial Department of Health to answer to the allegations of tender irregularities levelled against

According to reports, the chairperson of the bid adjudication committee, William Kaipa, was formerly employed by Sibusisiwe Contractors, one of the companies that won a tender of supplying coal to hospitals.

It is further alleged that: * the contract was not awarded to the lowest bidder

* there exist discrepancy in prices of coal, even among different bidders from the same town, and

* prices of the coal were not determined by the proximity of

contractor closest to the source of coal (Rustenburg) priced higher than the furthest, which is Wolmaransstad. The DA said in a statement that they will submit written questions to the MEC for Department of Health, Madoda Sambatha, requesting the adjudication report on the tender process and an explanation of the nature of its relationship with Kaipa.

"We call for an independent forensic investigation into this matter to ensure that all processes were above board. If irregularities are found, there should be serious consequences

> for those involved. Amidst having to wage a war on Covid-19 that is slowly rising in the province, the Department has recently been in the news for all the wrong reasons from the suspension of four senior officials over tender irregularities to the Public Service Commission (PSC) report slamming the MEC for being a referee and a player in the appointment of a senior official," said Gavin Edwards, the party's spokesperson on Health.

The DA said they will closely monitor the Department's next step of action to ensure that all wrongdoing is dealt
