Cash-In-Transit robbers apprehended hours after robbery

BONUS- RUSTENBURG- 12 suspects were arrested in Rustenburg on Wednesday (26 February) after they were linked to a Cash-In-Transit robbery that took place in Zinniaville on the same day.

During the arrest the police managed to recover four firearms and ammunition, cash as well as six suspected stolen vehicles.

According to information received from Colonel Brenda Muridili, it was reported that at about 09:15, three security guards were allegedly robbed of the money they had just collected from a supermarket at Zinniaville Shopping Complex on the Belflower Road. Shots were fired during the robbery but no injuries were reported.

The suspects then fled the scene in two vehicles, a Mercedes Benz and a Toyota Etios. The province immediately implemented a

72-Hour-Activation plan which saw all the necessary resources implemented timeously.

"The suspects were traced to a house in Bokamoso area in Rustenburg where eight men and a woman were arrested at the scene," Mudidili said.

Three illegal firearms and ammunition, four suspected stolen vehicles as well as cash that was robbed were recovered during the arrest.

Some of the team members moved to the next location in Rustenburg North, where they arrested three men and confiscated an illegal rifle and ammunition as well as two suspected stolen motor vehicles.

During the court proceedings the court was told how Matsile lured his victims, while pretending to safeguard them at night. All his victims were on their way home after a night out and hitchhiked on the R104 towards Tlhabane.

Social grants increased

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Social grants will in the next financial year increase by between 4 and 4.7%, Finance Minister Tito Mboweni announced.

The Budget delivered by the Minister, in Parliament on Wednesday (26 February), anticipates that the number of social grant beneficiaries will increase by almost one million over the medium term to almost 19 million by 2022/23.

The seven social grant categories will increase by between 4 and 4.7%. In this regard, old age and disability grants will increase by 4.5% to R1 860, up from R1 780.

Persons over the age of 75 and war veterans will receive R1 880, up from R1 800. Foster care will increase from R1 000 to R1 080, care dependency rises from R1 780 to R1 860 while

child support will now be R445, up from R425.





Sami Valimaki who ironically was outside the top 100 after day one at Al Mouj Golf. A stunning 64 in round three put Valimaki alongside Stone in a six way tie for the lead with 18 holes to play. In difficult, breezy conditions by the coast, both Stone and Valimaki had held the lead on their own during the final day but it was Frenchman Adrien Saddier who set the clubhouse target at 12 under.

Stone celebrated wildly as he holed a 20 footer on the last to get to 13 under but there was more drama to come as Valimaki holed from similar range for his own closing gain and a round of 70 to take the contest to extra holes. The duo halved the 18th in pars twice but when Stone sent his second shot crashing into the stand on the third trip and failed to get up and down, a par was enough to hand Valimaki victory.

Valimaki had a stunning 2019 on the Pro Golf Tour, winning four times including three consecutive starts at the end of the season.

Stone finished sixth at the Challenge Tour Grand Final at Al Mouj Golf in 2015 en route to graduating onto the European Tour and last season at this event he finished in the top 35 despite firing an 80 on Saturday. He finished 103rd on last season's Race to Dubai Rankings Presented by Rolex as he had his first full European Tour season without a win but he is pleased with the work he has been doing despite missing out in Muscat. 'Obviously I'm a little disappointed but I'm really proud with how I played over the last four days,' he said. 'It feels like I'm closer again.'
