## **Waterfall Mall photo incident: Beware before you share!**

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Rustenburg community was up in arms last week when a Whatsapp-message started circling about an alleged incident at the Waterfall Mall where pictures were apparently taken of a child.

The message alleged that strangers took pictures of a child who was waiting outside store with her mother. The voicenote then continues to allege that child traffickers have been active at the Mall previously and that, after Lockdown, it's become a problem again. "There is absolutely no truth in any of these allegations. No child has ever been reported missing in the Mall and there has never been a report of an attempted abduction either," Jessica Varty, spokesperson of the Waterfall Mall, said in a statement. Varty added that the Mall views these falsehoods in an extremely serious light and that they have already obtained legal assistance in handling the situation.

"While we are doing everything possible to ensure the safety of our shoppers, but it remains the responsibility of each person to safeguard their children and their personnel belongings," Varty said.

She concluded by giving shoppers the assurance that security at the mall is very
