He said they were very disappointed that Covid-19 vaccination registrations were decreasing. He encouraged people to get vaccinated, as vaccines are effective and safe.

"There will be a fourth wave but we don't know when or which variant or how severe it will be, but we have to protect ourselves by vaccinating.



Three arrested for fraud in Rustenburg

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The police in Rustenburg have arrested three suspects after they allegedly attempted to defraud a cellular phone shop of R148 000 worth of cellular phones.

According to information received from Captain Sam Tselanyane, provincial police spokesperson, it is alleged that on Thursday (12 August) at about 10:00, three suspects aged between 30 and 33 went to the shop situated at Waterfall Mall in Rustenburg and pretended to be representatives of a certain company. Moreover, the suspects informed employees that they were sent by the Company Director and they produced a fraudulent confirmation letter as well as fraudulent Identity Document's copies. The store manager became suspicious and informed the police.

Members from the Rustenburg Fraud Section attended to the complaint. The suspects were about to leave the store after finalisation of transaction when the police pounced on them.

Furthermore, preliminary revealed that one of the suspects defrauded the same company of five cellular phones with an estimated value of R185 000 last month.

Justice for Andrea - finally?

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - This week will see Gerhard Jansen van Vuuren, the man accused of the 2011 brutal murder of Andrea Venter, finally face justice.

Van Vuuren was Venters ex-boyfriend when he tracked her down in 2011. He then allegedly abducted her, tortured her for a weekend before stabbing her to death.

He was arrested and was standing trial when he was, inexplicably released on bail in 2013. Van Vuuren subsequently fled the country, going into hiding in Brazil. Three months later he was arrested by the Brazilian Federal Police and charged with immigration offences. He was sent to prison and would have been handed over to Interpol and returned to South Africa after serving his sentence. But once again luck was on his side and Van Vuuren was released without the knowledge of Interpol in 2016. He then managed to keep out of reach of law enforcement for n than four years before being apprehended for Andrea's murder in 2020. On 9 October 2020 the suspected killer arrived back in South Africa and was remanded in custody to stand trial.

The proceedings have seen many postponements the last ten months. "But he will have to finally face the consequences when the trial begins on 16 August," Andrea's father, the still grieving Dries Venter told Rustenburg Herald.




