Notice on formula milk use at **JST** hospital

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Job Shimankana Tabane wishes to inform members of the public that all mothers who use formula feeding must provide the formula when the child is hospitalized.

This, according to Kagiso Mbaiwa, spokesperson of the hospital, is in line with the Tshwane Declaration of support for breastfeeding in South Africa (2011), which indicates that government institutions will no longer be providing formula milk to mothers who choose not to breastfeed.

He said that babies in special care will not be given food or drinks other than breast milk, except when medically indicated in accordance to the medical indications for food other than breast milk as specified in the national breast feeding policy.

Vaccinations extended to young adults

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Young adults between the ages of 18 and 35 now have the opportunity to also get the Covid-19 vaccine after it was approved last week by cabinet.

Cabinet said it had received a report from the National Coronavirus Command Council (NCCC) indicating that over nine million vaccines had been administered to date, with over seven million people partially vaccinated and over four million fully vaccinated.

As part of increasing the vaccination rollout-programme, Cabinet approved the vaccination of persons aged between 18 and 35 from Friday (20 August.)

Fatal shooting at CCMA claims one in Rustenburg

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A 40-year-old man died and three others left injured in a shooting incident that took place on Thursday (19 August) at the offices of the Commission for Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration (CCMA), at Steen Street, Rustenburg CBD.

According to information received form Brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone, provincial police spokesperson, reports suggest that people were standing outside at the offices of the CCMA, when an unknown man fired several shots leading to the death of the 40-year-old man. He said three other men were seriously injured during the apparent attack, and they were admitted to hospital for medical

treatment. "The hospital condemns any form of corruption and members of the community are advised to to report such conducts perpetuated by our staff members to the hospital management or to the nearest police station," said Mbaiwa.

Contact lens solution recalled

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - If you are having a problem finding your contact lens solution, it might be because it was recalled. Due to the recent recall, South Africans are struggling to find contact lens solution at retailers.

This comes in the wake of one of the world's biggest suppliers of contact lens solutions and eye lubricants recalling products from shelves. The voluntary recall by Bausch + Lomb, affecting eight brands of contact lens solutions and lubricants, stems from a third-party supplier in Italy tasked with sterilising bottles, plugs, and caps. For South Africans who rely on contact lenses, finding the correct chemical solution for cleaning and disinfecting them has become a struggle in recent months. The shortage follows a far-reaching voluntary recall of contact lens solution products by one of the world's largest suppliers. Contact lens solution is specially formulated to disinfect and sterilise without irritating sensitive eyes. It's recommended that wearers replace the solution in their contact lens case every day. Suppliers in Europe, the Middle East, Russia, Hong Kong, and China have also been impacted by the voluntary recall. "While there is a low risk

of infection with these products, we have chosen to voluntarily recall these certain lots of products because we cannot confirm the supplier's conformance to process compliance requirements for some of the components of these products. No serious adverse events have been reported to date in association with this issue," a spokesperson for Bausch + Lomb said. The voluntary recall was issued after consultation with the South African Health Products Regulatory Authority (Sahpra). Retailers, pharmacies, eye care professionals, distributors and wholesalers who have purchased products directly from Bausch + Lomb have been asked to identify and remove any affected products. Additionally, retailers and distributors which have purchased products from Bausch + Lomb are required to display a consumer notice - detailing the voluntary recall of contact lens solutions and eye lubricants to customers - in a visible location.

Reported armed robbery

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A well-known retail shop was robbed by unknown armed men at the Waterfall Mall in Rustenburg on Saturday (21 August).

According to information received from Rustenburg police spokesperson, Sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi, about six armed men walked into the retail store with firearms. They robbed the store of an undisclosed amount of cash as well as cell phones. No injuries were reported and it is alleged that the robbers fled the scene in a white Toyota Almera and a silver Toyota Corolla. No arrests have been made so far however the police are requesting anyone who might have information that can lead to the suspect's arrest to contact their nearest police station.




