Expected fuel prices for August

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Motorists can expect to pay more for fuel this month as petrol prices will be increasing, according to information received from the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE).

With the Rand weaker against the US Dollar, the increases are as follows: petrol will increase by 91 cents a litre, diesel will increase by 55.58 cents a litre and illuminating paraffin will increase by 50 cents per litre and LPGas would increase by R2.26 per kilogram.

Most popular second hand cars

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - In these tough economic times, South African car buyers are desperate to find good value, which is generating increased demand for quality, well-priced vehicles in the used car market.

Leading motoring platform Cars.co.za indicates that low-mileage vehicles priced at just under R290,000, which were first registered between 2016 and 2019, are the most popular cars on the site.

"We looked at the number of enquiries put through to dealers during the past 90 days, rather than the majority of vehicles listed," said Cars.co.za's consumer experience manager, Hannes Oosthuizen.

A deeper analysis of the headline numbers of vehicles first registered between 2016 and 2019 reveals that user enquiries about listed used cars that were first registered in 2017 and priced between R200,000 and R300,000 represent the lion's share of the lead volume. The group said that 24.4% of leads for vehicles first registered from 2016 to 2019 are from that price bracket.

"It comes as no surprise to find that the 'R150,000 to R200,000' and 'R300,000 to R400,000' brackets are the next biggest. For vehicles of this particular age (2016- to 2019 models), nearly 60% of leads fall into the price range of R150,000 to R400,000," Oosthuizen said. He added that 31.8% of leads are for vehicles with mileages of between 10,000 km and 50,000 km and the overwhelming majority (81.4%) of all leads put through in those categories are for vehicles with a mileage of less than 100,000 km.

The biggest challenge for consumers, of course, is to find a vehicle from a reputable brand at a good price, but also with relatively low mileage. The best advice is to thoroughly shop around before handing over your money.

Emergency tax relief measures to be implemented

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa on Sunday (August 1) announced several emergency tax relief measures in response to the continuing Covid-19 pandemic and recent unrest that are aimed at helping affected and tax compliant businesses to recover and ensure livelihoods for employees.

The South African Revenue Service (SARS) will implement these tax relief measures because compliant taxpayers have paid their fair share of tax making it possible for government to provide such a temporary safety net in a time of extreme difficulty.

SARS Commissioner Edward Kieswetter said, "The first quarter of the current financial year had exceeded expectations and had outperformed revenue collections for the same period over the past three years."

He reiterated SARS' commitment of providing clarity and certainty to taxpayers so that they fulfil their legal obligations effortlessly and pay what is due. He said SARS will endeavour at all times to "make it easy and seamless for taxpayers when they transact with the organization".

The measures which SARS will implement are as follows:

- the extension of the expanded Employment Tax Incentive age eligibility and the amount that can be claimed, which is aimed at supporting employment in the most vulnerable sections of the labour market. This will apply for a period of four months and will come into operation on 1 August 2021 and end on 30 November 2021.

- Extension of the deferral of the payment of employees' tax liabilities (commonly referred to as PAYE) for tax compliant small to medium sized businesses. This will come into operation on 1 August 2021 and end on 31 October 2021.

- Tax compliant businesses with a gross income of up to R100 million will be allowed to delay 35% of their Pay -As- You Earn (PAYE) liabilities over the next three months, without penalties or interest.

- Deferral of excise duties on alcoholic beverages of up to three months by tax compliant licensees in the alcohol sector, on application setting out the circumstances justifying a deferral.

The full details of the tax relief measures can be found on the National Treasury website explanatory notes on the emergency tax measures.

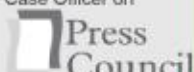

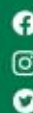

Run Your City Series 2021 event calendar updated!

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The organizers of the Run Your City Series have confirmed that the Joburg 10K Cityrun will take the form of a Virtual Race on Friday September 24, while the Durban 10K Cityrun and Cape Town 12K Cityrun are still scheduled to take place as actual events on Sunday October 31 and Sunday November 21 respectively!

"Staging a world class event requires months of planning and preparations," says Michael Meyer, Managing Director of Stillwater Sports and Founder of the Run Your City Series. "The current state of the pandemic and uncertainties surrounded by new waves of virus mutations, negatively impacts the planning process and ultimately jeopardizes the quality of the event. Taking the size of the Joburg 10K Cityrun into consideration, one of the main requirements would be to stagger the start of the race.

Although it sounds simple enough, it would have a knock-on effect. Not only would runners be standing around for hours waiting for their start, but an event that usually lasts a maximum of 3 hours (from start to finish) would easily drag on for 6 hours if not longer. Keep in mind that the city would have to shut down for this duration. Closing the city for so long would be unfair both towards runners and residents."

"Instead of cancelling the Joburg 10K Cityrun, which is the first event on the existing Run Your City Series calendar for 2021, we are excited to offer runners a fun alternative by going virtual and letting the Heritage Day Celebration continue," confirms Meyer. Meyer adds,


"Until further notice we will continue with our plans to host the Durban 10K Cityrun and Cape Town 12K Cityrun as actual events on Sunday October 31 and Sunday November 21 respectively."
