Deadline looming for expiry of firearm amnesty period

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Firearm owners whose firearm licenses have expired have mere days to legally apply for their licences of their firearms to be renewed.

Johan Martin, a lawyer and the franchisor of Legally Armed, advises these firearm owners to seize this opportunity and begin the process of handing over their weapons to the police as soon as possible and re-applying for licenses for the firearms involved.

"In addition to the possibility of criminal prosecution, such firearm owners run the risk that any license application for new weapons that they would now purchase will also be denied due to the license that has expired. We have repeatedly experienced that an expired license is grounds

for refusal. "In the previous firearms amnesty period (1 December 2019 to 31 May 2020), 27 336 firearms were handed in to the police. This is just a drop in the bucket considering that the licenses of more than 400 000 firearms have expired. "This amount of applications will not be processed overnight.

The sooner your application is submitted, the sooner you will get your license."

Legally Armed, a company that helps firearm owners with all aspects of firearm licensing (for private and business purposes), handled about 1 250 of the applications in the previous amnesty period.

"Our experience is that people tend to put it off until the very end. In addition, many people could not submit their applications on time due to the Covid-19 lockdown.

"Due to the pandemic, we hear from time to time about police stations being closed because some of the members contracted Covid-19. Consequently, it is even more important that applications are submitted in good time. You do not want to lose your firearm because you postponed the process to the last minute and your nearest police station was closed when you wanted to submit your application," says Martin.

Non extension of Temporary Employer-Employee Relief worrying

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Democratic Alliance has noted with concern reports that the Unemployment Insurance Fund (UIF) has decided not to extend the Temporary Employer-Employee Relief (Ters) saying that this would be a blow to cash strapped workers, especially in the sectors of the economy impacted by the adjusted level 3 lockdown.

"This is especially true for the tourism, hospitality and liquor industries. The DA maintains that for as long as the government prevents people from participating in the economy, it has a duty to mitigate the devastating economic impact with financial assistance," they said in a statement.

So far the UIF has disbursed roughly R56 billion in Ters benefits for the period from end of March to 15 October 2020.

"We know there is still money in the pot. A written reply from a DA parliamentary question last year indicated that the UIF was sitting on a total investment portfolio of R114 billion as at 31 March. with R60 billion in liquid assets and R54 billion in illiquid assets," the DA concluded.

Repo rate remains unchanged

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Monetary Policy Committee has decided to keep the repo rate unchanged at 3.5% per annum, Reserve Bank Governor, Lesetja Kganyago announced recently.

Kganyago said during the MPC meeting, two members of the committee preferred a 25 basis point cut and three preferred to hold rates at the current level.

In the third quarter of 2020, the South African economy grew by 66.1% quarter on quarter, seasonally adjusted and annualized, compared to the Bank's expected 50.3% growth. He said the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is now expected to be 3.6% in 2021 and by 2.4% in 2022; GDP growth of 2.5% is expected in 2023.

Drop in road fatalities

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - It has recently announced that the fatalities on South African roads during the 2020 festive season declined by seven percent when compared to the previous year.

Minister of Transport Fikile Mbalula said overall, we recorded 1 448 fatalities from 1 210 fatal crashes, which represents a 7% decline in fatalities and 10.3% decline in fatal crashes year-on-year.

The Minister released the 2020 Festive Season Road Statistics on Friday (22 January).

"Although we have recorded a decline in fatalities in eight of the nine provinces, we fell short in achieving our ambitious 20% target we set for this festive season," said Mbalula.

North West province recorded a decline 2.0%, with 99 fatalities compared to 101 in 2019/20.

One suspect dead, another injured at Fatima Bhayat

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A suspect was killed and a woman injured in a robbery that took place on Friday morning (22 January) in Fatima Bhayat Street in the Rustenburg CBD.

According to Russel Meiring, spokesperson for ER24, at 10:00 paramedics arrived on the scene to find the local authorities already in attendance.

A man, believed to have been a suspect, was found some distance outside a shop while a woman was found seated inside the one store. Medics assessed the man and found he had sustained fatal injuries while seeking cover during the shooting.

The woman was treated for her injuries and thereafter transported to a nearby hospital for further care. The details surrounding this incident are unknown at this stage, but local authorities were on the scene for further investigations.

Jackson Mthembu laid to rest

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The late government Minister, Jackson Mthembu, was laid to rest in an emotional funeral service at his home town of Emalahleni (Witbank).

The funeral took place at the Roman Catholic Church near Mthembu's home at Ackerville, Emalahleni, in Mpumalanga. Mthembu's untimely death after suffering complications of Covid-19 pandemic, shocked the nation to its roots last week. Mthembu was born at Schoongezicht farm in Emalahleni (formerly Witbank) in Mpumalanga on June 5 1958. He was the firstborn son of Mama Rosie Nantoni Mthembu. In his formative years, he attended Schoongezicht American Board Primary School and Kromkrans Farm School before moving to Elukhanyisweni Secondary School in Emalahleni. The

anti-apartheid activist, who was part of the liberation struggle inside SA, cut his political teeth in student politics in the 1970s and his activism continued when he was a student at the University of Fort Hare, resulting in his expulsion in 1980. Later Mthembu contributed immensely to the establishment of the Union of Metal Workers, in which he served as a senior shop steward at Highveld Steel Corporation. During the state of emergency in the 1980s, his political activism resulted in him spending several months in detention without trial, mostly in solitary confinement. He later rose through the

ranks when he was elected as the deputy regional secretary of the UDF and after the unbanning of the ANC, between 1990 and 1994, he worked as the full time ANC spokesperson in Mpumalanga. He served in several strategic roles including the ANC's national executive committee since 2007, as a MP, national ANC spokesperson under President Nelson Mandela from 1995 to 1997 and was appointed to the same role again from 2009 to 2014. He also served as the ANC chief whip, and minister in the presidency. Mthembu is survived by his siblings, wife Thembi Mthembu, their children and a grandchild.



Legendary talk-show host Larry King dies at 87

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Larry King, the longtime CNN host who became an icon through his interviews with countless newsmakers and his sartorial sensibilities, has died. He was 87.

King hosted "Larry King Live" on CNN for over 25 years, interviewing presidential candidates, celebrities, athletes, movie stars and everyday people. He retired in 2010 after taping more than 6 000 episodes of the show.

A statement was

posted on his verified Facebook account announcing his passing. His son, Chance, confirmed King's death last Saturday morning. "With profound sadness, Ora Media announces the death of our co-founder, host and friend Larry King, who passed away this morning at age 87 at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los

Angeles," the statement said. "For 63 years and across the platforms of radio, television and digital media, Larry's many thousands of interviews, awards, and global acclaim stand as a testament to his unique and lasting talent as a broadcaster." The statement did not give a cause of death.

Process on new valuation roll officially kicks off

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - For property owners who will be affected by the implications of the Rustenburg Municipality's new Valuation Roll, the process will be officially "on" with the Rustenburg Municipality's certification of the roll on January 31 2021.

From January 31, the process will involve viewing your property's proposed valuation on the roll if you

haven't done so to date and objecting to it should owners feel that the increase is not reasonable or market related.

Municipal valuations on property form the basis of assessment rates and are in many cases more than likely to be at least double the amount they have budgeted for on their monthly municipal accounts. With or without minor changes made to the roll, the new valuation roll will be implemented in terms of the

municipal budget from the 1st of June this year. Property owners fear that the latest development will be a heavy extra burden on land and property owners within the jurisdiction of the Rustenburg Municipality.

Property valuations were in the news and hotly debated since the roll-out of the new valuation roll early last year and have caused an uproar among property owners who in spite of a sharp decline in property market values throughout the past five to seven years, will now be expected to fork us much more than previously for indeed investing in the Rustenburg economy.

Furthermore, objecting to your listing

on the roll, implies considerably more than lodging a complaint with the municipality and hoping for a successful outcome.

Objections are to be accompanied by an alternative evaluation by a recognised evaluator and could also incur further costs in terms of legal expenses, albeit for the second time, since hundreds of outraged property owners have spent considerable amounts of money in acquiring an alternative valuation from evaluators/lawyers last year, only to hear that the valuation roll of 2020 will be put on hold while the roll is being revised and amendments were being made. Very little came from these undertakings however and to a large extent it seems that the Rustenburg Municipality is pushing for exactly the same controversial Valuation Roll than that of last year to be approved.



New 2021 school calendar

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Covid-19 has turned the world upside down, not to mention making life difficult for those in education. As per the Government Gazette 44096 published on 22 January 2021, the reopening of schools will take place in three stages:

School management teams (the principal, the school management team including education assistants, general assistants and non-teaching staff will return on Monday, 25 January 2021;

All teachers and educators to return Monday, 1 February 2021;

All public school learners to return Monday, 15 February 2021;

In addition, "independent schools must delay the date for the reopening of schools for learners to return to school for a period of two weeks from the date of the pronouncement of the Minister, on 15 January 2021". The gazette also points out that officials "may access school premises during the period of closure if required to do so, for purposes of preparation in anticipation of the reopening of schools".

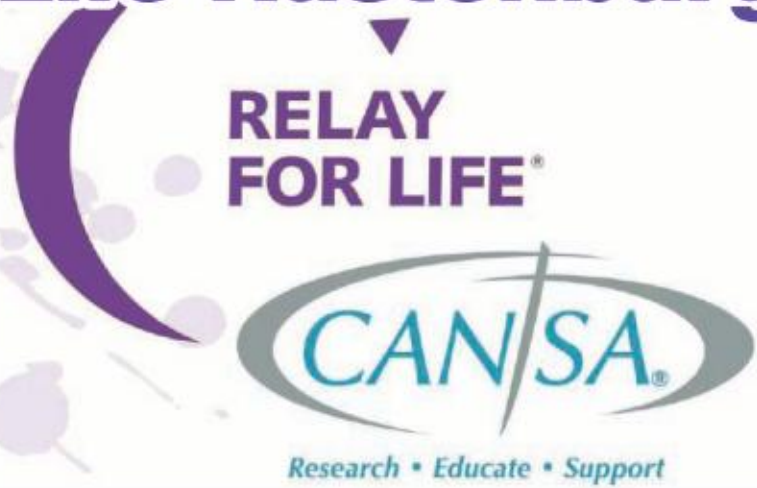

Even after a lot of the glitz and the glamour of the Currie Cup faded due to the prominence of the international series, the domestic competition still managed to get hearts racing slightly. But what was on show the past weekend was just sad. Adding to the gloom was the fact that the semifinal between the Stormers and the Sharks would be the final match to ever be played on the hallowed grass of Newlands.
