## **Voter** registration weekend postponed

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The independent Electoral Commission last week announced it has postponed the voter registration weekend by two weeks in light of the third wave of the Covid-19 pandemic currently affecting the country.

The commission resolved to reschedule the voter registration weekend from 17-18 July to the weekend of July 31 to August 1.

"The two-week postponement will have a knock-on effect on certain dates and activities associated with the proclamation election including delaying proclamation by four days until August 6.

However, the commission remains confident that successful elections can be held within a reduced election timetable of 82 days rather than the original 86 days," the Electoral Commission said.

# **ADJUSTED LEVEL 4: Here are** the details

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - South Africa will remain on the adjusted Level 4 lockdown for the next two weeks.

But, don't get your hopes up - alcohol is still off the cards.

The restrictions will now remain in place until 25 July.

In his national address on Sunday (11 July), Ramaphosa said that there is no other option than to extend the lockdown in the hopes of curbing the spread of the devastating Delta variant of the Corona

At present, the country has over 200,000 active Covid-19 cases. In the last two weeks over 4,200 South Africans have lost their lives to Covid-19.

"Our health system countrywide remains under pressure. By next week, daily hospital admissions across the country are likely to reach the levels observed during the peak of the first two waves. Covid-19 related deaths in hospitals are also increasing, and have surpassed those observed at the peak of the first wave," the president said.

While Gauteng is still the epicentre of these infections, Ramaposa said that cases are now surging in other provinces with the healthcare sector increasingly under strain. Infections are rapidly increasing in the Western Cape, Limpopo, North West, KwaZulu-Natal and Mpumalanga, he said.

The following restrictions will remain in

- The evening curfew remains in place from 21h00 - 04h00, and only those with permission to do so may leave their homes during this time;
- All social, religious, and political gatherings remain prohibited;
- \* Schools will remain closed until 26 July;
- \* The sale of alcohol remains prohibited. However, Ramaphosa said that some restrictions will be eased for some businesses. These include:
- \* Restaurants and eateries will be able to operate as normal while observing strict protocols - Such establishments may not accommodate more than 50 people at a time or, for smaller venues, more than 50% of their normal capacity;
- \* Certain other venues such as gyms and fitness centres may also reopen;
- Agricultural activities such as livestock auctions will be permitted.

The president said that Cabinet has decided that all business licenses and permits that expired between March 2020 and June 2021 will remain valid until 31 December 2022.

South Africa reported 16,302 new cases on Sunday, taking the total number of active reported cases to 208,709.

Up to 53,653 tests were conducted in the last 24 hours which represents a 30.4% positivity rate. A further 151 Covid-19 related deaths have been reported, taking total fatalities to 64,289 to date.

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa announced a bit of financial relief for affected sectors during his national address Sunday night (11 July).

The President said that the Unemployment Insurance Fund will extend the Covid-19 TERS scheme to businesses that have been impacted by the adjusted level 4 lockdown. The full details of the businesses and sectors that qualify will be published in a gazette shortly, Ramaphosa said. The president said that all business permits and licenses will also remain valid until 31 December 2022.

BONUS - RUSTENBURG -The vaccination programme is expected to gain momentum when those who are between the ages







BONUS - RUSTENBURG HERALD - Novak Djokovic has won his third consecutive title at Wimbledon on Sunday, defeating Matteo Berrettini in four sets and putting the Serbian tennis star in an elite class of players in the sport's history.

The win is Djokovic's sixth overall at the legendary British tournament. Sunday's championship marks 20 Grand Slam titles for Djokovic, which ties the record that had, until now, been shared by Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer. He acknowledged the two other greats following Sunday's win. "I have to make a great tribute to Rafa and Roger, they are legends of our sport and the two most important players I ever faced in my career," Djokovic said. "They are the reason why I am where I am today. They showed me what I needed to do to get stronger, physically, tactically and mentally. Over the last 10 years it has been an incredible journey that's not stopping here." Djokovic's other grand slam titles include nine wins at the Australian Open, three at the U.S. Open and two at the French Open. But, he said, the wins at the All England Club tournament rank at the top. "Winning Wimbledon was always the big dream of mine when I was a kid and I have to remind myself how special this is and to not take this for granted," Djokovic said following his victory. "It's a huge honor and a privilege." Djokovic (34) is now the only man to win the first three major tournaments in a season since Australian Rod Laver accomplished the feat in 1969. Now, Djokovic can set his sights on sweeping the tour's four Grand Slams this season with a win at the U.S. Open in late August — again, last accomplished by a male player when Laver did it 52 years ago. Djokovic - Nole to his millions of fans - said he will aim to be in as good of shape as possible heading into the final major. "I could definitely envision that happening and I hope I will give it a shot," he said.


