

### **Covid-19 cases continue to rise**

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - With the number cases of Covid-19 rapidly on the rise, South Africa has recorded a total number of 7 657 new cases on Sunday (June 13), representing a 17.2% positivity rate.

Gauteng had the most cases followed by the Western Cape and the North West Province with 521 confirmed cases. Bojanala Platinum District is still the highest in the North West Province with 209 new cases recorded and 3 039 active cases. Residents are, once again, urged to observe social distancing, sanitising and are reminded that wearing masks in public is compulsary.

## Valuation Roll a cut and dried matter

RUSTENBURG BONUS - RUSTENBURG - For Rustenburg Property owners the issue of Rustenburg's controversial Valuation Roll of the past year if not longer, is a cut and dried matter.

By noon on Tuesday, 15 June, the cut-off for objections to the municipality's ongoing Valuation Roll saga, will have expired. This means that Rustenburg property owners who have not managed to object to their new valuations in time for the deadline will have to be at peace with what is anticipated to be inflated assessment rates on their monthly Municipal accounts and that a hearing at the North West Board of Appeal might be their only and final recourse to keep on fighting the issue, albeit at substantial legal expenses and fees.

With the cut-off date on 15 June, the Rustenburg Municipality's 2021/22 Valuation Roll will officially take full effect in terms of (Section 49) of Municipal Finance Property Rates Act. Rustenburg Herald will resume reporting on the issue after final approval of the Rustenburg Municipal Budget of 2021/22.

#### Pension pay points to be used for registering senior citizens

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - People across the country are pulling out all the stops to help register pensioners for the COVID-19 vaccine, and now pension payout points where thousands queue for their monthly grant, are being targeted.

Volunteers from all walks of life are now pullulating Post Offices, Boxer Superstores and South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) pay points to ensure no pensioner is left behind. The mission is to get as many over 60s as possible, to sign up for the lifesaving jab, under the second phase of the country's vaccination rollout programme, that is currently underway. The Department of Health's Director-General, Dr Sandile Buthelezi, expressed his disappointment that the country was not even close to reaching 50% of the 5.5 million people who are over 60.

Meanwhile, Boxer has started distributing 250 000 flyers that will be handed out in their stores to promote the vaccination rollout.

Desert Race, the third round of the South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) that takes place over three days and almost a thousand kilometres on 18, 19 and 20 June in the Upington area, has drawn an extremely competitive field in the Production Vehicle Category and the most teams the series has seen this season will make their way to the Northern Cape Province where they will go for gold and hope to bag a healthy amount of points towards their championships.

This event traditionally runs in Botswana and the only marathon event on the calendar has been relocated to Upington this year due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and the logistics of cross border travel. This offers teams a new opportunity to test their equipment and themselves over three days and almost a thousand kilometres of harsh conditions and unchartered terrain and a level playing field for all. The TGRSA 1000 Desert Race will also include the Road to Dakar Challenge offering privateer crews who enter the opportunity to win a free entry to the Dakar Rally. This year the winning team will also

receive a cash prize of 8 000 euros to assist as with the necessary funding to compete in the world's toughest automotive race in either 2022 or 2023.

Combining statistics of the annual marathon event held in Botswana for the past two decades and the fact that two different teams have claimed victory so far this season, makes predicting a winner quite risky. With the desert race this year sponsored by Toyota Gazoo Racing SA, the team would like nothing better than to be the first winners of their inaugural event. The team will also feature the new petrol-powered 3.5 litre turbo charged V6 engine in a new generation Toyota Hilux racing chassis - it is yet uncertain who will be behind the wheel of this vehicle.

If the TGRSA 1000 Desert Race victory befell either the defending champions, Henk Lategan/ Brett Cummings or the former double desert race winners, Giniel de Villiers and navigator Dennis Murphy, it will be a better result than their 2019 TDR 1000 result when both teams experienced problems in Botswana. Lategan will also be hoping to make up for lost points as he did not compete in the season opener. The TGRSA 1000 Desert Race starts on Friday, 18 June with the Pirelli Qualifying Race of approximately 130 kilometres that includes a mini dune section. The results will determine the starting order for Saturday when teams will take on a 200 kilometre loop at 08:00. Upon completing the loop once, there will be a mandatory 30-minute service stop before they tackle the loop again. The combined results of Friday and Saturday will determine the starting order for the final day with a new 200km loop awaiting teams. This loop will again include a mini dune section, dry riverbeds and hard-pack and a compulsory 30-minute de-control before they do the loop again. All the racing action will start and finish at the Upington Expo Showgrounds where the headquarters and Designated Service Park (DSP) will be situated. No spectators will be allowed at the showgrounds as per the current Covid-19 regulations. Enthusiasts can follow the action on the RallySafe App on iOS and Android
