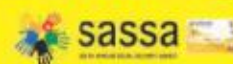

The spokesperson of the Free State Department of Health, Mondli Mvambi, explained on Friday (7 May) that the province is officially in its third wave of COVID-19 infections. This after COVID-19 infections in the province soared by 427 out of the national 2 150 new cases. Mvambi said that it's getting worse and the Free State have to ensure that they put all hands on deck. "We need to communicate as if our lives are dependent on it. Our current ability to treat people may not last if unnecessarily stretched to the limit by the non-adherence to Covid-19 measures". The Free State currently has the third-highest active cases - 4 028 - preceded only by Gauteng with 4103 and KwaZulu Natal with 5 494 as of Thursday (6 May). With 3558 cases, the Northern Cape isn't far behind. The Free State health department is now urging communities to take care of themselves and adhere to all COVID-19 non-pharmaceutical measures. "It is important that you should take personal responsibility to avoid getting infected and when infected seek medical help and appropriately isolate or quarantine as you may be advised by health practitioners".

DISTRICTS FLAGGED FOR A RISE IN INFECTIONS - In addition, Health Minister Dr Zweli Mkhize said the department noticed a worrying trend of increasing COVID-19 infections in a number of districts, including Free State, Gauteng, Northern Cape and North West. He added that these districts have been flagged by the National Institute

for Communicable Diseases (NICD) as "under observation" due to a 14% increase in infections. "The significant rise in percentage changes should be taken as a serious warning".

Mvambi said it's vital for communities to ensure everyone plays their part to prevent the health system "from getting overwhelmed if everyone is sick".

This includes adhering to social distancing protocol and government regulations, as well as washing and sanitising regularly, and wearing masks when in the public or in the company of others.

"We can see that all over the world, there is no health system that is able to withstand the high numbers of demand for high flow oxygen, high care, and intensive care units".

GLOBAL COVID-19 STATS

At the time of publishing, the global caseload stood at 157 636 813 confirmed cases, with a death toll of 3 286 497, while recoveries are now at 135 112 056. The United States is still the worst affected country in the world, with 33 418 826 confirmed cases, 594 911 deaths and 26 324 757 recoveries, followed by India with 21 892 676 confirmed cases, 238 270 deaths and 17 930 960 recoveries.

South Africa is currently 20th on the list, with a caseload of 1 592 326, along with 54 687 deaths and 1 513 202 recoveries.

Province concerned by low dam levels

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - During the past weeks, some dam levels in the North West Province have remained constant while others continue to decrease.

The fact that South Africa has high probability of a natural drought; continuous monitoring of our water resource is necessary as it enables maximum preparedness and adaptive measures of a possible drought condition. Mr Chadwick Lobakeng, the Department of Water and Sanitation's (DWS) Provincial Head in the North West Province, has indicated that the North West Province is currently receiving 400 millimetres of rainfall which is less than average of what the country is receiving which is 600 and 800 millimetres of rainfall. Currently there has been a slight drop in most of the dam levels; Molatedi Dam, North West Province's largest dam; decreased from 57.5% to 56.8%; Olifantshoek Dam from 51.4% to 50.7%; Lindsleyspoort Dam from 53.5% to 52.7%; Koster Dam from 54.7% to 54.3%; Madikwe Dam from 82.5% to 78.7%; Boskop Dam from 100.5% to 100.4%; Taung Dam from 98.7% to 97.2%; Hartbeespoort Dam from 96.7% to 90.9; Vaalkop Dam from 91.9% to 91.3%; Those dams that remained unchanged since last week are; Disaneng Dam at 72.2%, Ngotwane Dam at 57.8%; Marico Bosveld Dam at 99.8%; Setumo Dam at 48.5%; Bospoort Dam at 101.2% Among the dams with fuller dam capacity, Roodekopjes Dam increased from 101.7% to 103.6% and Klipvoor Dam from 99.8% to 100.4% The Department of Water and Sanitation continues to encourage the public to apply good practices towards water use and evade from polluting our natural resources such as rivers and dams.

New outbreak of 'bird flu'

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The South African Poultry Association (Sapa) announced a second outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza - 'Bird Flu' - that has occurred on a broiler breeder farm on the East Rand of Johannesburg.

The association said the farm was under quarantine and the birds were being culled and disposed of under Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development (DALRRD) supervision. Sapa said that this outbreak was in the same compartment as the first layer hen outbreak. "The effects on the ongoing supply of broiler meat are minimal, and consumers are assured that broiler meat and eggs remain safe to eat provided proper cooking protocols are observed, with temperatures exceeding 60°C achieved," a spokesperson for the association said. The initial outbreak of avian flu H5 on a layer farm on the East Rand was identified as HPAI H5N1. This was not the same strain experienced in June 2017. However, any outbreak of HPAI was treated as extremely serious and virulent, and the poultry industry remained in a state of high alert, Sapa said. Quarantine protocols remained in place on the farm concerned. The company concerned made the responsible decision to cull all 240 000 hens to protect surrounding farms and the South African poultry industry in general.

All biosecurity measures remained in place. The replacement cost of these hens was R20 million. A second outbreak of HPAI H5 was reported on a North West broiler breeder farm, which had culled 7 000 broiler breeder birds. Last week, the dead birds were sent to Onderstepoort Veterinary Research Institute for analysis and sequencing, and was not expected to materially affect the trade restrictions already in place from the neighbouring countries.

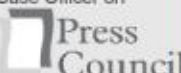

Former NWU rugby captain dies in crash

BONUS - The rugby fraternity is in mourning after the tragic passing of the former NWU captain.

North-West University captain and Leopards loose forward Tiaan Bezuidenhout died in a car accident this past Saturday morning (8 May). According to Capt Adèle Myburgh, the accident occurred on the N4 under the Kroondal bridge. Captain Myburgh said that Bezuidenhout's Ford Ranger bakkie collided with a truck. The 26-year-old Bezuidenhout died on the scene. The truck driver sustained injuries and was taken to a local hospital for treatment. Bezuidenhout attended both primary and secondary school in Rustenburg.

and then went to study towards a senior phase education degree at the North West University's Potchefstroom campus. At university he excelled on the rugby field as an No 8 earned 10 Varsity Cup caps in 2018. He also represented the NWU 1st XV in the Pirates Grand Challenge and the Leopards in the Currie Cup First Division. As NWU's first new captain in three years, Bezuidenhout led them all the way to the 2018 final before hanging up his boots at the end of the season. Jonathan Mokuena, who was NWU's coach at the time, remembers Bezuidenhout as a special player and person. "He was someone who I could count on to keep discipline in the team. When I announced him as our captain at the beginning of 2018, I still remember how he cried and how immensely proud he was to represent NWU and captain them. Seeing his face then is something I will treasure forever. I knew then that I had made the right choice as a coach," Mokuena told SA Rugbymag. Varsity Cup extended its deepest condolences to Bezuidenhout's family and the larger NWU community.

Akanyang Rakodi (41) was sentenced to life imprisonment for murder, life imprisonment for rape, 15-years imprisonment for robbery and five years imprisonment for fraud by the North West High Court sitting in Mogwase recently.

Mokgosi's lifeless body was found on Monday (29 June 2020) at her rented place in Magong Village near Mogwase by neighbours and members of the School Governing Body (SGB) co conducted a search after the young teacher failed to report for duty. 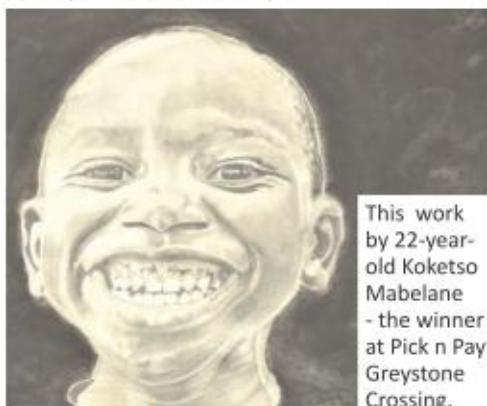
Art winners announced

One dies in head-on-collision

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - A 42-year-old man has succumbed to his injuries following a head-on-collision between two bakkies on the R24 (old Johannesburg Road) on Monday morning (10 May).

According to information received so far one vehicle was travelling from Johannesburg to Rustenburg and another from Rustenburg heading towards Johannesburg when the incident took place around 07:00. The deceased was travelling alone while the other bakkie has a driver and a passenger, who both sustained minor injuries and were transported to a local hospital for further treatment. Preliminary investigations conducted by Constable Mbulelo Wettes revealed that the deceased may have been from Mogwase according to Rustenburg police spokesperson, Sergeant Ofentse Mokgadi.

Cousins in deadly fight

He shot the two, killing one and injuring the other, he later turned the gun on himself and died. The other cousin is being treated in hospital for serious injuries. 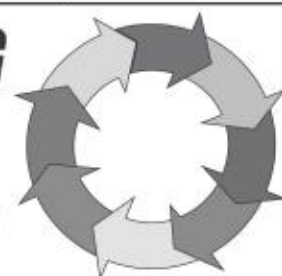
