Phase 2 vaccination rolledout for elderly

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Phase 2 of South Africa's vaccination process has begun and it is targeted at the elderly population, those who are over the age of 60 as well as residents who are most vulnerable to the virus.

The Health Minister, Dr Zweli Mkhize said by Monday (17 June) the department would dispatch 7 707 SMSs to health workers and 4 288 SMSs to citizens over the age of 60.

"Monday phase two will start as planned with Pfizer vaccines at 87 sites across the country- 83 in the public sector and four in the private sector," said Mkhize.

This according to the minister Monday (17 June) marks the end of the Sisonke Programme which has already vaccinated a total of 478 733 South Africans. The programme had received a total of 500 000 doses. About five million senior citizens are targeted to be completed by the end of June.

Municipal objection period extended



National State of Disaster **EXTEND**

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Cabinet has once again approved the extension of the National State of Disaster on COVID-19 until Tuesday (15 June). According to a statement released recently the extension considers the need to continue augmenting the existing legislation and contingency arrangements undertaken by organs of state to mitigate against the impact of the disaster on lives and livelihoods. The extension has been approved in terms of Section 27 (5)(c) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act 57 of 2002).



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - South African broadband users are reaping the benefits of major price cuts - and free speed upgrades on fibre-to-the-home products with fibre network operators and ISPs fighting for market

The fibre price war was started by Openserve when it upgraded speeds and cut prices on its fibre products in March. Openserve said the speed upgrades came at no additional cost to ISP partners as an incentive to enable them to easily upgrade their customers. Frogfoot quickly followed suit by permanently increasing the line speeds of fibre packages of 50Mbps and below. Herotel was next, improving the value proposition on its 10Mbps, 50Mbps, 100Mbps, and 200Mbps packages. The fibre network operator has also added new 75Mbps and 1Gbps services. Herotel CEO Van Zyl Botha said their unique approach - building aerial

fibre networks instead of trenching - is behind the latest value improvements. Unlike fibre network operators like Openserve and Vumatel, Herotel sells fibre products directly to consumers which Botha said helps it to keep prices low. The latest fibre network operator to increase speeds was MetroFibre. It announced last month that it was increasing speeds and would be introducing a new 300Mbps service. The company informed its ISP clients that their speeds will be increased free of charge from 1 June 2021. These improved value propositions from fibre network operators quickly filtered down to consumers with ISPs cutting prices and bumping up speeds for free.

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) will host that they must wear a mask or appropriate a national voter registration weekend on 17 and 18 July, ahead of the 2021 Local face covering and observe social distancing. Government Elections in October.

Over this weekend all 23,146 voting stations around the country will open from 08h00 to 17h00 to assist new voters to register. Existing voters can also use the time check and, where necessary, update their registration details, the IEC said.

The commission said it will also embark on a nationwide voter education and awareness campaign to encourage all eligible voters to participate in the elections scheduled to be held on 27 October 2021.

"The 17 and 18 July registration weekend is the only general voter registration opportunity for voters to register and check their registration at their voting stations. However, on-going voter registration will continue during working hours at local IEC offices until the proclamation of the elections," it said.

Registered voters will still be able to amend their registration details through the website of the Electoral Commission.



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Sugarbelt 400, the second round of the 2021 South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) that takes place in the Eston/Mid Illovo area on the outskirts of Pietermaritzburg in KwaZulu-Natal on 21 and 22 May, is a second opportunity for various teams in the Special Vehicle Category to score their first points in the overall as well as the Class A, Class P and Class G Side-by-Side Championships. It will also be a second chance for only a handful of teams to add more points towards their title onslaught. The opening round of the SACCS at Dullstroom in Mpumalanga took its toll on the Special Vehicle teams resulting in only two teams in Class A scoring points and while they will focus on bagging additional silverware and points, they will be chased by those who will know that they cannot allow the gaps in the championships to get too big. To add to the excitement, is the fact that the Sugarbelt 400 has not been run for six years and a visit to this area will be a first experience for quite a few teams. The 2019 overall and Class A Drivers' Champion, Lance Trethewey, is a local businessman from Wartburg and is no stranger to the Sugarbelt 400. Trethewey currently leads the way with navigator, Adriaan Roets in the Schalk Burger Motorsport BAT after drawing first blood at Dullstroom. In accordance with COVID-19 protocols, the event will be closed to spectators, but enthusiasts can follow the action on the RallySafe App, sponsored by Toyota, and can be downloaded free of charge for Android and iOS devices. The racing action starts on Friday, 21 May at 13:00 with the 50km Pirelli Qualifying Race to determine the starting order for the main race on Saturday, 22 May. The leaders will take on the first of two 160km loops at 08:00. There will be a compulsory 30-minute service break after the first loop with all the action happening from the Beaumont Eston Farmers' Club where the Race Headquarters as well as the Start/Finish and Designated Service Point will be situated.
