## Phase 2 vaccination rolled- out for elderly

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - Phase 2 of South Africa's vaccination process has begun and it is targeted at the elderly population, those who are over the age of 60 as well as residents who are most vulnerable to the virus.

The Health Minister, Dr Zweli Mkhize said by Monday (17 June) the department would dispatch 7 707 SMSs to health workers and 4 288 SMSs to citizens over the age of 60.

"Monday phase two will start as planned with Pfizer vaccines at 87 sites across the country- 83 in the public sector and four in the private sector," said Mkhize.

This according to the minister Monday (17 June) marks the end of the Sisonke Programme which has already vaccinated a total of 478 733 South Africans. The programme had received a total of 500 000 doses. About five million senior citizens are targeted to be completed by the end of June.

## Municipal objection period extended

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - Rustenburg property owners who did not get around to objecting to the new municipal valuation of their residential, business or agriculture property under jurisdiction of the Rustenburg Municipality before the deadline of Friday, 30 April, can indeed sigh with relief.



The Municipality has announced that the objection period has been extended by another 45 days since the municipality has noted that not all residents in the area have received written notices (Section 49) of the new value of their properties within the necessary and legally required period of 90 days. Property owners, businessmen and farmers now have until 15 June 2021 to lodge objections to the new valuation of their property at the Rustenburg Municipality if they wish to do so. Property owners who have not done so in recent months, are invited to view their new valuations at Room 127, First Floor, of the Rustenburg Municipality in Beyers Naudé Avenue. Objections may also be handed in at this office. 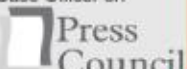

# SARS: Employers can face jail time...

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Employers who do not submit their Employer Reconciliation Declarations, may get a very nasty surprise.**

The deadline is approaching for employers and other third-party providers to submit their data and Employer Reconciliation Declarations (EMP501) to SARS together with tax certificates [EMP501 and IRP5/IT3(a)'s]. Filing Season for employers commenced on 1 April 2021 and closes on 31 May 2021. This means employers and other third-party agents who have not yet submitted their reconciliation documents to SARS, only have a little more than a week left to comply with this tax obligation. Companies are required to complete and declare the latest and accurate payroll information (PAYE, UIF and SDL) about their employees and the amounts they have paid to SARS. The data that must be submitted should

include the Monthly Employer Declarations (EMP201) information, payments made and Tax Certificates [IRP5/IT3(a)'s] generated, covering the full tax year from 1 March 2020 to 28 February 2021.

**Let's look a bit closer at the consequences of SARS Payroll Tax non-compliance**

Employers may be fined or face an imprisonment of up to two years if they fail to submit correctly completed EMP201 or EMP501 returns to SARS on time. They may suffer the same consequences if they have deducted or withheld employees' tax from their employees but did not pay it over to SARS. Issuing an IRP5/IT3(a) if you are not an employer or you have not been authorised by the employer to issue

an IRP5/IT3(a) is also a criminal offence. Similarly, if an employer fails to issue an IRP5/IT3(a) to an employee, the employer is guilty of a criminal offence. Importantly, especially following the Covid-19 pandemic causing many businesses to close their doors, employers need to notify SARS should they have ceased to be an employer. They also have to ensure that their final reconciliations are submitted to SARS and employees are issued with a final IRP5/IT3(a).

**Employers need to be aware of the following penalties which are imposed on employers who:**

- Fail to submit a complete EMP501 reconciliation on or before 31 May 2021 – they will be penalised for each month that a complete reconciliation remains outstanding. Depending on the number of months

outstanding, the penalty is up to 10% of the total employees' tax liability.

- Fail to pay any amount of employees' tax for which the employer is liable to SARS on or before the due date for payment – they will be penalised by an amount equal to 10% of the outstanding amount. The EMP501 and IRP5/IT3(a)'s can be submitted easily and conveniently using the latest version of e@syFile™ Employer or through eFiling for those with 50 or less employees. A video is available on SARS' YouTube channel. Employers are cautioned that once a reconciliation document has been submitted through a specific channel, any amendments for the same reconciliation period can only be made through the same channel.

## National State of Disaster

# EXTENDED

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Cabinet has once again approved the extension of the National State of Disaster on COVID-19 until Tuesday (15 June).** According to a statement released recently the extension considers the need to continue augmenting the existing legislation and contingency arrangements undertaken by organs of state to mitigate against the impact of the disaster on lives and livelihoods. The extension has been approved in terms of Section 27 (5)(c) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act 57 of 2002).

## Broadband users enjoying big price cuts

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - South African broadband users are reaping the benefits of major price cuts - and free speed upgrades on fibre-to-the-home products with fibre network operators and ISPs fighting for market share.**

The fibre price war was started by Openserve when it upgraded speeds and cut prices on its fibre products in March. Openserve said the speed upgrades came at no additional cost to ISP partners as an incentive to enable them to easily upgrade their customers. Frogfoot quickly followed suit by permanently increasing the line speeds of fibre packages of 50Mbps and below. Herotel was next, improving the value proposition on its 10Mbps, 50Mbps, 100Mbps, and 200Mbps packages. The fibre network operator has also added new 75Mbps and 1Gbps services. Herotel CEO Van Zyl Botha said their unique approach – building aerial

fibre networks instead of trenching – is behind the latest value improvements. Unlike fibre network operators like Openserve and Vumatel, Herotel sells fibre products directly to consumers which Botha said helps it to keep prices low. The latest fibre network operator to increase speeds was MetroFibre. It announced last month that it was increasing speeds and would be introducing a new 300Mbps service. The company informed its ISP clients that their speeds will be increased free of charge from 1 June 2021. These improved value propositions from fibre network operators quickly filtered down to consumers with ISPs cutting prices and bumping up speeds for free.

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) will host a national voter registration weekend on 17 and 18 July, ahead of the 2021 Local Government Elections in October.**

Over this weekend all 23,146 voting stations around the country will open from 08h00 to 17h00 to assist new voters to register. Existing voters can also use the time check and, where necessary, update their registration details, the IEC said.

The commission said it will also embark on a nationwide voter education and awareness campaign to encourage all eligible voters to participate in the elections scheduled to be held on 27 October 2021.

"The 17 and 18 July registration weekend is the only general voter registration opportunity for voters to register and check their registration at their voting stations. However, on-going voter registration will continue during working hours at local IEC offices until the proclamation of the elections," it said.

Registered voters will still be able to amend their registration details through the

"Click, Check, Confirm" functionality on the website of the Electoral Commission.

**What you need to register**

In order to register as a voter, you must be:

At least 16 years old

A South African citizen

In possession of a valid South African ID document – either a green barcoded ID book or a smartcard ID.

Voters must be registered at a voting station in the ward in which they are a resident and must provide an address or detailed description of a place of residence.

Proof of address (e.g. in the form of a utilities account) is not required for registration. Voters who have moved house since the last election as well as those with incorrect, incomplete or missing addresses are especially urged to update their details.

"Voters visiting a voting station in person to register or update their details are reminded

that they must wear a mask or appropriate face covering and observe social distancing. Hand sanitizing facilities as well as stationery will be provided at each voting station," the IEC said.

Voters are encouraged to bring along a pen even though pens will be provided and sanitized routinely, the IEC said.

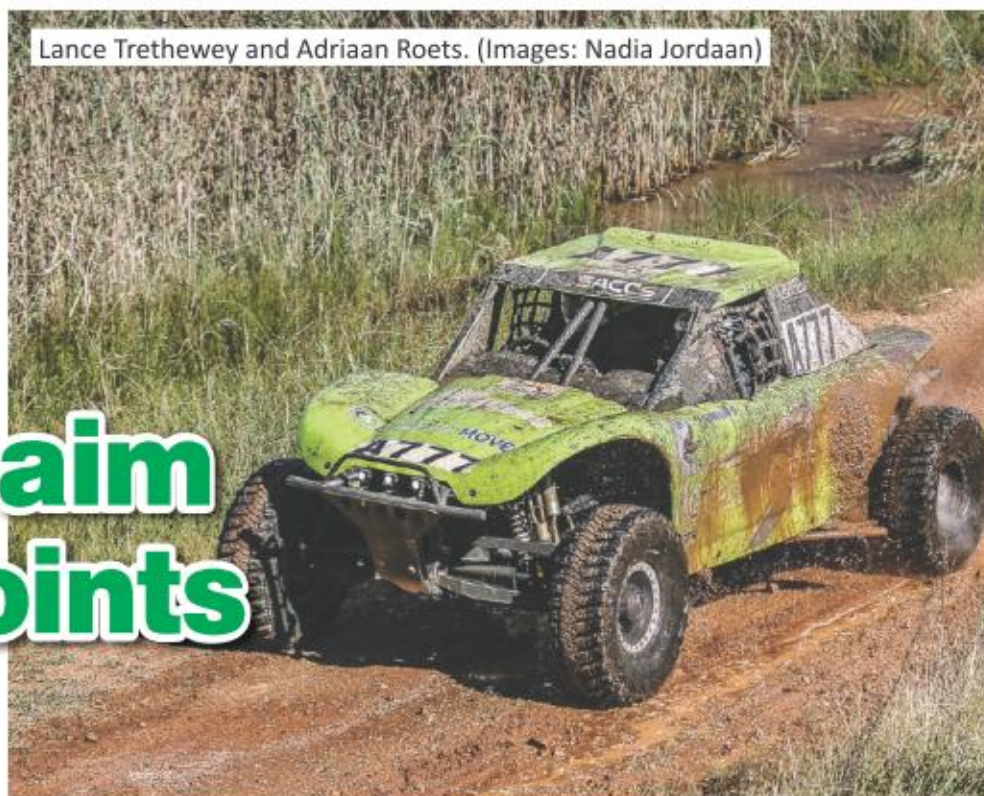

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Sugarbelt 400**, the second round of the 2021 South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) that takes place in the Eston/Mid Illovo area on the outskirts of Pietermaritzburg in KwaZulu-Natal on 21 and 22 May, is a second opportunity for various teams in the Special Vehicle Category to score their first points in the overall as well as the Class A, Class P and Class G Side-by-Side Championships.

The racing action starts on Friday, 21 May at 13:00 with the 50km Pirelli Qualifying Race to determine the starting order for the main race on Saturday, 22 May. The leaders will take on the first of two 160km loops at 08:00. There will be a compulsory 30-minute service break after the first loop with all the action happening from the Beaumont Eston Farmers' Club where the Race Headquarters as well as the Start/Finish and Designated Service Point will be situated.
