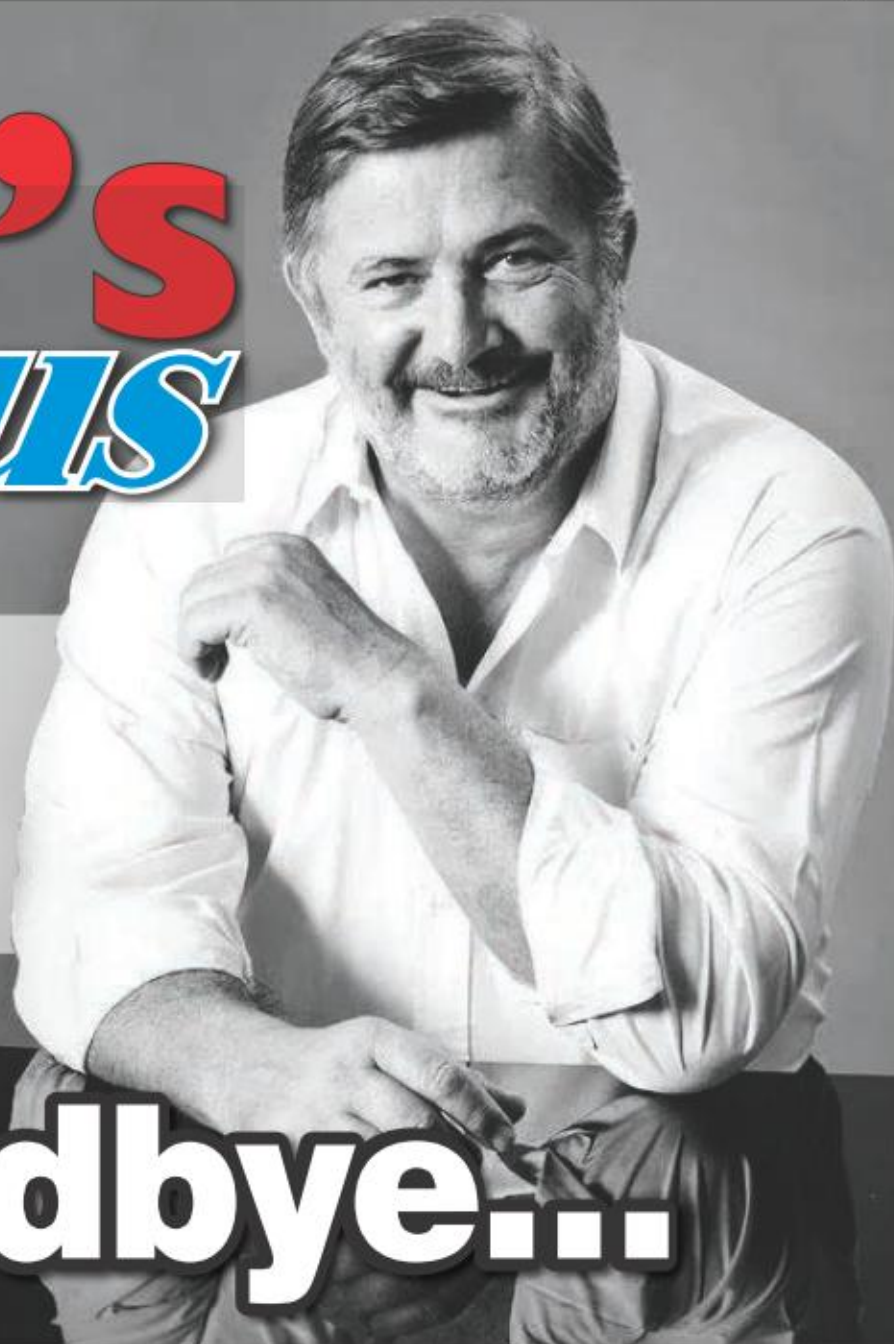

The email includes a parcel number that was not generated by the post office. Members of the public who receive the notice should delete it immediately.

Evotel speeding up completion of fibre roll-out

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Residents of Rustenburg are eagerly waiting for the completion of the Evotel fibre network to be connected to faster and reliable internet.

The contractors Veatel and local, Mosia Ke Mosia, are diligently working in Protea Park, Safari Tuine, Waterval East, Boschdal and Rustenburg SP to have the network infrastructure completed as soon as possible.

"It is difficult to determine the estimated time the installation will be fully completed. There is a multitude of things to consider and take into account with a build like this; for example, the weather can have an impact, the availability of building resources, or if the teams doing the installation were to accidentally hit any municipal infrastructures, there could be delays. In these cases it is all dependent on the municipality and how long we have to

wait for them to repair the pipes or cables," says Bradley Bekker, Head of Business Development for Evotel.

The original installation was supposed to be an aerial installation, which necessitated some additional poles to be erected with municipal lampposts as part of the infrastructure. The aerial installation was however stopped by the municipality and changed to a trenched solution. In the change-over to a trenched solution some poles still remained in some places around the town.

Evotel's Bekker however assures the Rustenburg Herald that as the build proceeds, the poles will be removed. "All the additional poles we had to install as part of the previous aerial installation will be removed before the completion of the project," he stresses.

The company already donated a number of the poles to the Rustenburg SPCA. The SPCA will be using these to erect rental advertising space for local businesses, which will also act as an additional way of getting funding for the non-profit organisation to look after and feed the destitute animals in their care.

"We fully support the work the SPCA is doing and their efforts are close to our hearts, so we were happy to donate the poles to the organisation. We are also talking to them about additional support we can supply, which we will inform the residents of Rustenburg about soon," Bekker concludes.

UIF fraudster warning to the public

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Department of Employment and Labour has warned the public of an individual who is allegedly posing as its employee, and unlawfully charging R200 for assistance with Unemployment Insurance Fund (UIF) claims.

In a statement, the department said the individual, identified as "Sharleen Chetty", falsely claims she is an employee of the department that helps thousands of clients daily with their UIF claims for a fee of R200.

"The individual also uses an email address that is similar to those of the department's officials.

"The department wishes to reiterate that assistance with all its services like the UIF and Compensation Fund claims is free."

They said it was illegal for any agency or person purporting to act on behalf of an applicant to charge a fee for submitting an application for UIF benefits.

"Clients are, therefore, urged not to contact the individual or pay any person for assistance with UIF claims."

The matter has been referred to the UIF's Risk Management, Anti-Corruption and Integrity Management for investigation.

NP200 and Hilux bakkie owners warned

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The police in Rustenburg have issued a warning to owners of NP200 and Hilux bakkies to be extra vigilant as these cars are being stolen at an alarming rate in and around Rustenburg.

According to information received from Captain Elsabé Augoustides, Rustenburg Cluster police spokesperson, the police in Rustenburg have seen the number of cases of theft of these vehicle rise. She advised motorists to be extra vigilant and to report to the police if they find themselves victims of this trend.

NW facing Third Wave; Rustenburg a hotspot

BONUS - RUSTENBURG HERALD - South Africans waited with bated breath when it was announced that President Cyril Ramaphosa will address a 'family meeting' on Sunday night (30 May).

Last week a lot of speculation, especially regarding rules around the selling of alcohol, started circulating on social media when it became clear that South Africa was officially entering a third wave of Covid-19 infections.

President Ramaphosa's address followed meetings of the National Coronavirus Command Council (NCCC), the President's Coordinating Council (PCC), and cabinet. But the country could sigh a collective sigh of relief when the sale of alcohol - which has a widespread effect on the whole of the South African economy - was not prohibited again. However, the curfew was moved an hour earlier, to 23:00. In effect this means that restaurants, pubs and all other non-essential businesses must close at 22:00 to ensure that their staff do not contravene curfew. The limit for people attending gatherings has also been adjusted to 100 people indoors and 250 outdoors. Or, where the space is smaller, to not more than 50% of the venue's capacity. This includes churches. Funerals are still limited to a 100 people, with overnight vigils and 'after tears' functions prohibited.

The latest adjustments have come into effect Monday (31 May).

The presidency said the government and social partners are continuously monitoring infection, treatment, and patient recovery rates.

There is also a strong focus on compliance with health regulations and other prevention measures.

Ramaphosa said delaying the spread of the virus is particularly important now as the country has started its vaccination programme. With the number of daily new Covid-19 cases rising rapidly, the Ministerial Advisory Committee has advised more stringent lockdown restrictions in place.

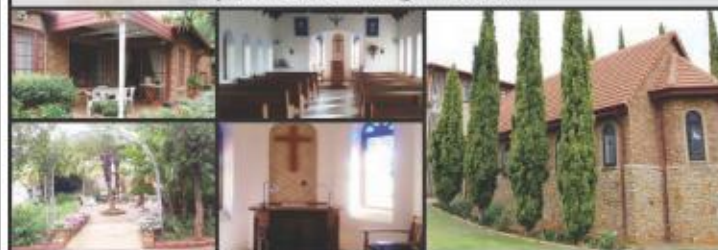

Former special vehicle champs Trethewey and Roets take strong lead in championship

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The former overall and Class A Special Vehicle Champions, Lance Trethewey and Adriaan Roets, now competing under the Schalk Burger Motorsport banner in their BAT Venom, have been undefeated after the first two rounds of the 2021 South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) and are the early leaders in the championship standings.

The 2019 champions have won both the Mpumalanga 400 and Sugarbowl 400 and have opened a gap to the rest of the field that will have to start their catch-up game if they want to catch them. Trethewey/Roets have bagged 60 points in the Overall Special Vehicle Championship and lead Nico du Rand/JG Claassen (28 points) by 32 points. Du Rand/Claassen won Class G for Side-by-Side (SxS) vehicles with their Waterworld Can-Am Maverick at the recent Sugarbowl 400 and finished third overall in the category. 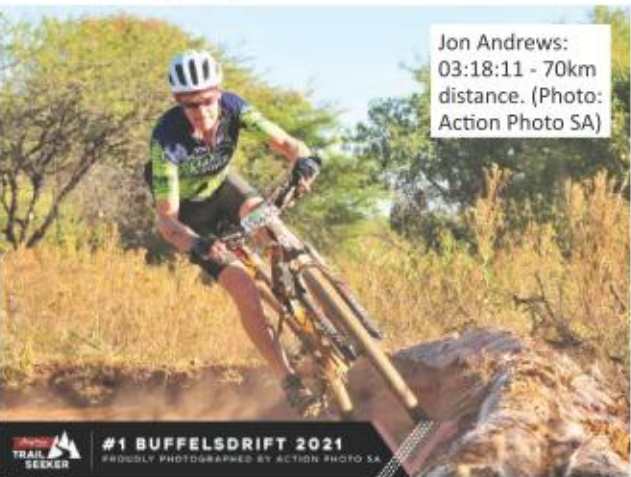
