Gender-based violence should be more than a name

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - "GBV" - A neat little acronym that places Gender-Based Violence a comfortable arm's length away.

We increasingly hear those three letters spoken but they hide the ugly truth about this particular form of violence without saying its name. That ends today!

Gender-Based Violence is a harmful act directed at someone because of their biological sex or gender identity. In South Africa, that gender is overwhelmingly female, and uncomfortably young. Of the 53 293 reported cases of sexual offences from the 2019/2020 police crime statistics, 31 100 were against women and 22 070 were against children.

"Every year for 16 Days of Activism, we, as a society, highlight Gender-Based Violence and renew calls to eradicate all forms of violence against women and girls. But, in the 23 years since South Africa joined the 16 Days of Activism campaign, what has really changed? Life is cheap, freedom is denied and women are disempowered. To stop Gender-Based Violence we need to stop hiding behind an acronym and stop accepting this as the norm. Let's have real, honest and uncomfortable conversations that move us to take action," says Cristianne Wendler, Head of Programs at Shout-It-Now, a South African non-profit company that empowers youth to own their sexuality.

This innovative social enterprise currently provides free, mobile prevention community-based HIV Gender-Based services, Violence services, sexual and reproductive health services, and life skills programmes to communities in Gauteng and the North West. Too many grandmothers, sisters, daughters and wives survive violent acts every single day. The vast majority fear the repercussions and won't come forward to report the crimes. With those in positions of authority and tasked with protecting the vulnerable also being accused of being perpetrators and turning a blind eye to this scourge, even "safe spaces" aren't safe. Many of these survivors already have their voices taken away, so it's up to all of us to call Gender-Based Violence out by its name and break the silence.

BONUS- RUSTENBURG- It is with concern that Impala Platinum Holdings Limited (Implats) announces that an underground incident occurred at Impala Rustenburg's 6 Shaft on Sunday (28 November).

According to information received seven employees were working at the bottom of the shaft when the area became inundated as a result of a mud rush. Two employees safely exited the area with minor injuries and are receiving counselling and support. As at 18:00, five employees remained unaccounted for. Two search and rescue teams were dispatched in an effort to locate the missing employees. The Department of Mineral Resources and Energy and the relevant union leadership have been informed of this incident.

Contact is being made with the families of the missing employees in order to provide updates on the search and rescue mission, as well as counselling and support.

This regrettably follows a separate incident at the 16 Shaft mining complex on Saturday (27 November) in which a contract employee was fatally injured during underground drilling operations.

"The safety of our employees is our utmost priority, and our mine proto teams are doing everything possible to locate the missing employees. It is with deep regret that we record this incident, which comes at a time when we have made significant improvements in the Group's safety performance, with several historic safety records achieved in the past year. Our thoughts and prayers remain with all involved, "said Nico Muller, Implats Chief Executive Officer.

All operations at Impala Rustenburg's 6 and 16 Shaft complexes have been suspended until a full and comprehensive report is available.

He concluded on a more positive note that South Africa will come through the storm. "We will defeat this virus," President Ramaphosa told the nation.

The WHO labeled Omicron a "variant of concern" on Friday — a designation given to variants like Delta that require close scrutiny from public-health officials.

But scientists are still waiting on lab studies to determine how well coronavirus antibodies either from natural infection or vaccines hold up against Omicron. They're also watching carefully to see how quickly the variant spreads across the globe, particularly in countries with higher vaccination rates. South Africa has fully vaccinated just 24% of its population so far; compared to 59% in



Rustenburg Constable convicted for negligent loss of firearm

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Provincial Commissioner of North West, Lieutenant General Sello Kwena has welcomed the sentencing of Constable Fortune Godwin Moemise (36) who was recently sentenced by the Bafokeng Magistrates' Court in Tlhabane for negligent loss of a firearm.

According to information received from North West Police spokesperson, Brigadier Sabata Mokgwabone, Moemise from Rustenburg Detectives, was sentenced to R12 000 or 12 months imprisonment, half of which is suspended for five years on condition that he is not convicted of contravention of provision of Section 120 (s) of the Firearms Control Act, 2000 (Act No. 60 of 2000) during the period of suspension. Mokgwabone explained

that the conviction emanated from an incident in which he forgot his service pistol at his girlfriend's place on Thursday (20 August 2020). A friend to the Constable's girlfriend took the firearm and allegedly used it to commit attempted armed robbery and attempted murder. The friend was arrested and separately charged for attempted armed robbery and attempted murder as well as unlawful possession of a firearm and ammunition.

shareholders **BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Impala** Platinum (Implats) has acquired

> a 24.5% stake in Royal Bafokeng Platinum (RBPlat) for around R10

Implats has now offered to buy out the remaining shareholders on the same

On Monday (29 November), Implats announced it had acquired the stake from institutional shareholders last week and has now offered the remaining shareholders R150 per RBPlat share - which consists of R90 cash plus 0.3 ordinary shares in Impala.

This, Implats said, represents a premium of 22% to RBPlat's closing share price of R121.92 on 24 November 2021. The offer comes as a surprise as Impala were previously outbid when Northam Platinum made a R17.2 billion offer to acquire 32.8% of RBPlat shares from its parent company, Royal Bafokeng Holdings. On 19 November, Northam announced the acquisition had been implemented. Industry experts have noted that there are greater synergies to be realised between RBPlat and Implats than with Northam.

Having just closed the deal, Northam is unlikely to take up the Implats offer. RBPlat has now constituted an independent board to review and consider the offer made to all shareholders.

"Implats' offer to acquire a majority stake in RBPlat offers compelling operational and financial strategic, benefits for all stakeholders. It presents an opportunity to create a sizeable and sustainable Western Limb production base capable of capitalising on significant, unique synergies available as a result of the contiguous nature of Impala

Rustenburg and RBPlat's operating assets. It will deliver tangible socioeconomic benefits for the region and its communities, including employment security and through

sustained direct and indirect benefits for the various industries and stakeholders

supported by the mining activities in the greater-Rustenburg region,"

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The 2021 South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) will go down in the books as one of the most challenging seasons to date with title battles in the Production Vehicle Category only being finalised at the seventh and final round of the season.

It will also be remembered for the high number of extremely capable and technologically advanced vehicles that were pushed into the field by professional and privateer teams. In the end it was Henk Lategan and Brett Cummings (Toyota Gazoo Racing SA Hilux) who clinched their third consecutive overall and FIA championship titles. It was, however, not all plain sailing. Lategan, who had to watch the opening race from the side line as he was still recovering from a shoulder injury brought on by a crash in the 2021 Dakar Rally, and Cummings, who navigated for stand-in driver and multiple SA National Rally Champion, Guy Botterill at the first race, won three events together and were involved in a ferocious battle with Lance Woolridge/Elvéne Vonk (Ford Castrol Cross Country Ranger) until the final race.

Brian Baragwanath/Leonard Cremer (Century Racing CR6) were regulars amid the frontrunners and a victory and a healthy amount of points at the TGRSA 1000 Desert Race in Upington and two more podium finishes, secured the team third place overall as well as in the FIA Class.

The top five was rounded off by two teams who scored the same amount of points after a frustrating seasons for both. In the end Chris Visser/Albertus Venter (Toyota Hilux) finished fourth with Gareth Woolridge/Boyd Drever (Ford Castrol Cross Country Ranger) rounding off the top five. The SACCS is, however, about the various class championships and here competitors earned an additional five points for starting a race. Lategan earned the FIA Drivers' Championship title (198 points) and finished just ahead of Lance Woolridge (182 points) with Baragwanath third (143 points). Gareth Woolridge (116 points) finished fourth ahead of Visser (110 points) who missed the opening round and therefore missed out on the five point bonus. Toyota won the Manufacturer's Award (547 points) ahead of Ford (348); Century Racing (201); Nissan (135) and Renault (38 points).



AXX FACTS: Get vaccinated! The 4th wave is on it's way

Unvaccinated south Africans and those not fully vaccinated are urged to get their jabs as soon as possible, following the emergence of the Omicron variant, which is responsible for most of Gauteng's infections, and is spreading across the country.

The Omicron variant was first described in Botswana and subsequently in South Africa has been praised for its early detection and reporting of the variant, which has far more mutations than any previous variants. It is not yet clear whether infection with Omicron causes more severe disease compared to infections with other variants, but it appears to spread more easily.

On Sunday, November 28, the World Health Organisation said researchers in South Africa and around the world are conducting studies to better understand many aspects of Omicron and will share their findings as they became available. The left of vaccination of Omicron coincided with a sudden rise in Covid-19 infections in South Africa, and has prompted the authorities to yet again call on the nation to get vaccinated. It is now predicted that South Africa could enter its fourth wave within the next few weeks, if not sooner.

The rate of vaccination has slowed down in South Africa, which is alarming given that there is overwhelming scientific evidence that vaccination is the best defence against serious Covid-19 infections.

4. Side effects
The DoH notes that there have been no deaths in South Africa attributed to Covid-19 vaccines. "It is normal to have some side effects, such as flu-like symptoms. If you're worried, feel short of breath or if your heart is racing, VACCINATE 5. Be a Vax Champ and stop the spread of misinformation! 6. What we do know
While there is much we do not know about the new variant, we do know that getting vaccinated, wearing a mask, washing your hands regularly, and avoiding crowded places and packed indoor gatherings will help prevent the spread of all variants, and decrease the likelihood of landing up in hospital, should you contract the disease.
