Mother and son arrested for alleged stock theft

BONUS - LEFARAGATLHE - A 45-year-old mother and her 18-year-old son were expected to appear in the Bafokeng Magistrates' Court in Tlhabane on Monday (8 November), for possession of suspected stolen live stock.

The duo were arrested at Lefaragatlhe village near Tlhabane following an incident in which a shepherd was killed and livestock robbed at a cattle post in Serutube village outside Rustenburg on Thursday (4 November).

According to information available at this stage, reports suggest that three herdsmen were herding cattle at about 17:00 when three unknown males emerged from the bushes. The trio caught one of the herdsmen and tied his hands with a rope, then robbed him of his money and a cell phone. The suspects went to another herdsmen (25), tied his hands and also robbed him of his cell phone and cash. Furthermore, the suspects allegedly demanded the cattle and in the process, shot and killed the 25-year-old herdsmen while his colleagues were assaulted with the butt of a firearm. The suspects then drove out a herd of cattle from the cattle post. For more information read this week's edition of the Rustenburg Herald.

Farmers warned against scam

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development has warned the public, especially farmers, against unscrupulous and faceless people who promise to fast-track farmers' application for agricultural Covid-19 relief funds.

The department said these faceless people are calling farmers and sending text messages requesting an amount of R2000 as an upfront payment, promising to fast track their Covid-19 relief fund applications. According to the department, the scam artists are parading as government officials. The fraudulent text message doing the rounds reads:

We see last year you have applied for Agricultural Covid-19 fund of R50 000, we want to process it fast so can you

send R2000 so we can process it before December. Capitec Bank W. WALSH Acc no:1332654701, Branch Code 470010." The department has appealed to farmers to be careful of such fraudulent activities. "We are appealing to all our farmers to be careful of these fraudulent activities coordinated by unscrupulous and faceless people. Farmers and members of the public must know that they do not pay for any government service, especially agricultural relief funding which is meant to mitigate the impact of Covid-19.

Trethewey/Roets and Larney Brothers are SACCS Special Vehicle Champions as battles continue to the end

- The field in the Special Vehicle Category of the 2021 South African National Cross Country Series (SACCS) might have been relatively small this year, but it delivered exciting racing in both the Class A and Class G Championships, and although the main titles have found new owners, the order in the runner up standings could still change after the final flag drops at the Toyota Gazoo Racing SA Parys 400.

With six of the seven races of the SACCS done and dusted, the upcoming TGRSA Parys 400 will form the seventh and final round of an exhilarating season, and the final chance for competitors to add points to their tally to confirm or better their standings. As in 2019, the overall and Class A championship titles again went to Lance Trethewey and Adriaan Roets (King Price Xtreme BAT) who bagged the honours with two rounds to spare. In the Overall Drivers' Championship, Trethewey has earned 183 points, 88 points clear of second-placed Cecil Larney (95 points) who is also leading the Class G championship for Side-by-Side vehicles where teams are competing with the Can-Am Maverick SxS. The season has been a baptism of fire for the Larney brothers, Cecil and Elardus, but they persevered and scored points after each event, like Trethewey/Roets. Larney, however, is not out of the woods yet as Trethewey's team-mate, Boela Botes (Porter) is currently third (86 points) after winning the recent Vryburg 400.

The TGRSA Parys 400 takes place on 20 November from the Parys Airfield in the Free State.
