



On assessment, medics found that one man had already succumbed to multiple injuries while at least twenty others had sustained minor to serious injuries.

The patients were treated, and the seriously injured were provided with pain-relief medication before being transported to Rustenburg hospitals for further care. Local authorities were on the scene for further investigations.


