# Passionate Eastern Cape young leader uplifts NW school

#### BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Lindiwe Ngcobo is a PHD candidate at Fort Hare with a passion for uplifting communities.

After graduating from the Boxer Youth Leadership Programme in 2007, Ngcobo went on to become the first female South African student to lead the Junior Chamber International Organisation at Fort Hare and complete her Ph.D in Agricultural economics while searching for ways to achieve sustainable rural development in South Africa.

She is also in the process of writing her first book.

Despite being chaotically busy with her studies, this Ludeke born and raised future leader recently started a campaign to assist school pupils by providing essential toiletries in order to prevent pupils from missing school and performing poorly in class.

After researching and studying different schools in different provinces, Ngcobo chose Kgosi Shope Secondary School in the North West as her first recipient. She contacted Boxer Superstores for assistance and received a large donation of essential toiletries including sanitary towels, toothpaste and other bathroom essentials from the supermarket to ensure that pupils at Kgosi School would be able to attend class without the challenges they had been facing due to the lack of essential toiletries.

The handover, which took place on the 20th August, was widely celebrated by the pupils, teachers and local

"The reason that I selected the school is that it has learners whose family, social, or economic circumstances hinder their ability to learn at school.

The other reason is that I wanted to remind every South African that we are one nation, despite differences in home languages and cultural practices. We need to love and appreciate one another. I am Xhosa from the Eastern Cape, but I have chosen for this first effort a Tswana community in the North-West Province.

You don't always need financial resources to assist people. In my case, I used my leadership and writing skills to assist those in need. The South African woman must stand up and lend a hand to build the nation.

This will remain a central theme of my life's work," said Ngcobo.

# **Scourge** andchild needs attention

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The South African National Civic Organisation (SANCO) on Sunday (12 September) called for an urgent national summit to develop a new strategy to tackle the scourge of teenage and child pregnancies.

This follows recent reports that over 40 000 children across the country, some as young as ten years are pregnant while others have given birth.

"We are horrified by the extent to which moral decay has set in and literally robbed our children of their innocence and childhood. We are therefore calling on our communities to unite against widespread prevalence of the sugar daddy syndrome to ensure that perpetrators that are destroying the future of our children are exposed to face the wrath of the law," highlighted SANCO National Spokesperson, Simon "SPD" Skhosana condemning the scourge of child pregnancies.

Skhosana maintained that the adjusted rotation school programme had allowed most learners to be home on their own during the day without adult supervision had exacerbated a situation that existed, but that which society chose to ignore. He said that child headed households are at great risk of perpetrators who are targeting the vulnerable and needy children for sexual grooming.

Skhosana urged government, traditional leaders, business, churches, faith -based organisations as well as non-government organisations to redouble efforts to fight poverty, unemployment and inequality.



### Husband, all beaufall ellow Investon

BONUS - KOSTER - Police here are searching for three men who attacked a couple on Wednesday night.

According to North West Police spokesperson, Capt Aafje Botma, the incident occurred at about 20:30 on the night of the 8th.

The husband and wife were allegedly sitting outside on the veranda on the farm Windy Valley in the Koster area when they were attacked by three armed suspects wearing balaclavas.

The husband (63) was overpowered and he and his wife were taken inside the house and seriously assaulted with a crowbar. Capt Botma said that, apparently, they were also hit with a sjambok in the face.

Another person who was on the scene said that the attack was beyond brutal and that it looked like the female was tortured with an iron, as it appeared that she had burn wounds on her breasts and innerthighs.

According to Capt Botma the suspects allegedly got the safe keys from the victim and it is suspected that they took handguns. They also stole two cell phones and an amount of cash before they fled in the couple's white Isuzu bakkie.

Both victims were taken to hospital for medical treatment.

No arrests were made yet.

## Adjusted level two: A tiny bit more freedom

BONUS - RUSTENBURG HERALD - What shall we call it?

The Covid-cha-cha-cha? Because it's one step forward, then a step back; one sideways - and then repeat it all again.

And we are dancing in adjusted level two as from Monday (13 September). The new regulations include:

\* The curfew will start one hour later tonight, at 23:00. It will end daily at 04:00. This means that South Africans can spend two hours longer drinking at a restaurant, pub or shebeen. Under Level 2, the written regulations confirm, licensed establishments may serve alcohol until 22:00 every night. That is when they must also close their doors, under a long-standing policy that, in order for employees to make it home in time, places of entertainment must close an hour before

\* Liquor stores can sell alcohol Mondays to Fridays from 10:00-18:00

Gatherings may now accommodate: 250 people indoors or 500 outdoors. Or, if the venue is smaller, it may accommodate 50% of capacity. This is also applicable for church services.

 Funerals remain restricted to no more than 50 people, and, as before, night vigils, after-funeral gatherings and 'after-tears' gatherings are not allowed.

In his address on Sunday night (12

September) President Ramaphosa said that these restrictions will be reviewed in two weeks.

The government will also present its plan for vaccine passports at this time so that people can attend sporting and other events, he said.

The president warned that existing regulations remain in place - including the compulsory wearing of masks, social distancing and a ban on after-funeral gatherings.

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Road Traffic Management Corporation (RTMC) has confirmed to in a statement that drivers whose licence cards expire between 1 September 2021 and 31 March 2022 have not been given an extension to renew their licence cards.

Transport Minister Fikile Mbalula recently that the grace period for renewing licences that expired between 26 March 2020 and 31 August 2021 was extended to 31 March

"To give motorists a fair opportunity to renew their licences, while we are rolling out several measures to improve efficiencies and resolve challenges, we have decided to extend further the grace period for the renewal of licences," Mbalula said.


