

expensive spuds

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Wedged, fried, mashed or baked your spuddy buddy is getting more expensive.

Potato prices in South Africa became more than 20% more expensive over the past week due to a low supply of the staple vegetable. Limpopo continues to reel from frost damage that affected crops at the end of July.

At the beginning of August, the average weekly price for the staple vegetable climbed by as much as 22% to R66,43 for a 10kg bag.

The price is 7% higher than last year at the same time, Dr Johnny van der Merwe, managing director of agricultural information group Agrimark Trends (AMT), said in his weekly YouTube video that tracks the market prices for fresh produce in South Africa.

Limpopo, a major producing region of potatoes for this time of year, experienced icy weather in July that resulted in frost that left some crops damaged.

By the end of August, farmers were sending lower volumes to the fresh produce markets, and in turn, causing a spike in prices for some vegetable commodities such as spinach and peppers.


Last week, potatoes delivered to markets by farmers decreased sharply, by 14%, Van Der Merwe said.

The recent frost in Limpopo is an added blow to the prices of potatoes which had already been on the rise. In June, prices for a 10kg bag soared by as much as 12% to R56.53, as the industry was still recovering from heavy rainfall in January and cold weather conditions in the northern parts of the country. The rainfalls came during a critical planting season. They simultaneously weighed on production, which resulted in weaker potato harvests in east and west Free State and some parts of the Northern Cape, all of which were the significant sources of potatoes at that time of year. "Because of the rain that we had this year... the winter prices for potatoes are the highest up till now," a market analyst explained.

The analyst added that potato volumes delivered to markets last week were the lowest since 2018.

The market expects sales volumes to stay below normal levels in October.

According to Potatoes SA, 81 million bags of potatoes were sold in August, which was only just over 100 bags more than a year ago.



In general, the app simplifies funeral planning using its in-app checklist, which helps users through the process, including registering the death and claiming funeral insurance. It eliminates the burden of having to phone around searching for the best service providers and keeping track of them by managing the tasks for users in the

The app offers

R14,000 and going up to R88,000. The packages include the hearse, the casket or urn, cemetery booking, gravesite decoration, body repatriation, tent and chairs, transport, picking up of the deceased and death registration, and other related paperwork. It also has full-service cremation packages starting at R22,430. The list of services includes booking a pickup of the deceased's body from a hospital, a hospice, or their home. They can also use the app to order caskets and urns and arrange for the burial or cremation. The app also has church and hall listings that can be used for funeral services. Users can also book transport services for the funeral, flower

arrangements, tombstones, catering, and cleaning. It also allows family and friends to send groceries and or flowers to the bereaved family. Matebese admits that the idea of a funeral app seems weird and can make some uncomfortable and said that introducing the concept in the funeral industry proved a challenge." Death has always been a taboo topic, and when it was discussed, it was done by the elders, and the tradition has been to call and visit funeral homes. Sendoff disrupts that model, and the idea of major change in a very traditional industry has been a challenge," said Matebese. Sendoff currently operates in Gauteng only and plans to expand nationally in September. It has more than 15 service providers so far.




Implementation of routine road maintenance project well underway in Moses Kotane municipality

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Good progress has been made on the implementation of the routine road maintenance (RRM) project in Moses Kotane Local Municipality, the South African National Roads Agency SOC Limited (SANRAL) said during its flagship Taking SANRAL to the People stakeholder engagement session recently."

The routine maintenance is for three roads, the R510 national road from Rustenburg to the Limpopo border, R556 national road from R510 intersection to R565 intersection, and R565 national road from Rustenburg to R556 intersection," said Fulufhelo Luruli, SANRAL Northern Region project manager.

The roads agency confirmed that Shonisani Rambau Construction was appointed as the contractor in November 2020."The subcontracting tender advertisement has now closed, the appointed contractor is in progress with the evaluation process, some of the opportunities to evaluate include the procurement processes and level of jobs this three-year contract will create, as well as setting targets for skills development. SANRAL will sublet 50% of the contract value to targeted SMMEs for sub-contracting. Opportunities are available for local SMMEs (CIDB 1 to 4) for sub-contracting," said Luruli. RRM projects enable SANRAL to maximise the number of jobs created, especially for the youth and vulnerable groups that include black women and people with disabilities. The local SMMEs and the communities who attended the engagement were able to seek clarity regarding how SANRAL is deciding about the 50% contract value aimed at local SMMEs for sub-contracting. They also wanted to know if SANRAL will target the local resources available in Moses Kotane municipality for this project. SANRAL confirmed that sub-contracting opportunities are targeted at local resources

SANRAL Northern region stakeholder coordinator, Jullecsia Saul, provided clarity of how this works. "If the main contractor is a black female, the main contractor will get 60% of the project and 40% will go for the sub-contracting; if the main contractor is a black male, the main contractor will get 50% and 50% gets sub-contracted; if the main contractor is a white male or female, the main contractor gets 40% and 60% gets sub-contracted to the community," said Saul. "For the RRM projects in the Moses Kotane Local Municipality, 50% will be sub-contracted to the community because the main contractor, Shonisani Rambau Construction is a black male-owned company. Tender opportunities for sub-contracting have been advertised and are intended for all SMMEs within the boundaries of Moses Kotane municipality," Saul explained. Japhta Mothusi Raphadu attended the engagement in his capacity as the councillor for Ward 16 in Welgeval, Moses Kotane. "I am happy that SANRAL opened the floor to listen to the views of its stakeholders regarding its projects in the municipality. What should happen is to find a way for all parties to meet each other halfway. We all want to see roads such as the R510, R556, R565 and R556 national roads maintained. SANRAL and the community have to engage continuously to ensure that there is implementation at the end of the day," said Raphadu.
