

# Serial rapist gets life behind bars

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Provincial Commissioner of North West, Lieutenant General Sello Kwena welcomed two life sentences and additional 28 vears imprisonment handed down to a 30-year-old serial rapist by the Bafokeng Regional Court in Tlhabane on Wednesday (15 June).

The sentences emanated from three separate incidents wherein victims were raped and robbed of their cell phones and clothes. In the first incident, a 15-yearold girl was with her boyfriend and walking to a nearby shop at Pitso Section in Phokeng outside Rustenburg at about 20:00 on Tuesday (5 January 2021), when approached by the convict. The latter chased and forced the boyfriend to leave by throwing stones at him. The girl was consequently taken to the nearby bushes and raped. On her way back home after escaping, the girl met her boyfriend and her aunt who took her to Phokeng police station to lay charges of rape and common robbery. In the second incident at about 19:00 on Wednesday evening (13 January 2021), a 22-year-old woman was from her aunt's place at Kotokoto Section, Phokeng and going back to her residential place at Lenatong Section when the convict approached her and volunteered to accompany her as he was also going to the same area. They were walking and about to cross the bridge when the accused grabbed and dragged the woman to the nearby bushes and raped her. He then robbed her of her cell phone and clothes before fleeing

from the scene. The matter was reported to the police for investigation. In the third incident which occurred 30 minutes after the second one at Lemenong Section, the convict met and approached a 14-yearold minor who was on her way home. He wanted to know if she was not afraid of walking alone and ultimately dragged her to the bushes and raped her. Thereafter, he robbed her of her cell phone and clothes. Subsequent to the incident, the victim ran to Phokeng police station where she reported the incident and also found the 22-year-old woman reporting a rape case and common robbery. Consequently, the police and security officers with assistance of members of the community, searched for the convict at Lenatong Section where he was found in possession of the victims' clothes. He was arrested and eventually identified by the 15-year-old victim which also he raped on Tuesday, 5 January 2021. The accused was finally sentenced to two life terms for two counts of rape. He was further handed 20 years imprisonment for another rape and four years for each of two counts of common robbery. Read more about this in this week's edition of the Rustenburg Herald.

This is predicted by economists.

Crude supplies are likely to remain tight amid limited spare capacity among producers, said investment bank UBS in a research note on

South Africa's local petrol prices have also not been helped by a tumultuous rand, which has slipped in the last week on expectations of further rate hikes in the US and the possibility of a global recession.

"In South Africa, the rand is at risk of further marked weakness as the differential between South African and US interest rates are eroded on the US interest rate hike this month, which would add to fuel price pressures, as rand weakness increases the rand oil and petroleum product prices," is the opinion of a senior economist at a mayor bank. Consumers should take note that the current fuel price increase forecast is for another R2.00 per litre hike in the price in July - to R26.18 per litre, the highest petrol price South Africa has ever experienced, while the diesel price is set to rise by R1.18/litre, taking it to R24.27/litre, again unprecedented. Petrol prices in South Africa are around double what they were about two years ago, and unsurprisingly inflation is more than double as food cost inflation has increased substantially. Adding to the pressure is the end of fuel price interventions announced by the government in March. Fuel prices in July will see R1.50 kept off the general fuel levy. In August, this will be reduced to 75 cents per litre as the other 75 cents are added back.

This day is observed on June 14 to promote awareness about the need for blood donation and thank voluntary, unpaid donors for their life saving gifts of blood.

"This day aims to promote regular blood donation to ensure that all individuals have access to affordable and timely supplies of safe blood in times of emergency needs. This year's commemoration was themed "Donating blood in an act of solidarity. Join the effort and save lives".

Donors must be between the ages of 16 and 75 years old. And the donor should weigh a minimum of 50 kg (and platelets a minimum of 55 kg), in good health, leading a low risk lifestyle, you have not donated blood in the last 56 days (and platelets

in the last 14 days), your pulse is between 60-100 regular beats per minute, your blood pressure is below 180 systolic (first number) and below 100 diastolic (second number) (180/100mmHg) and your haemoglobin level is 12.g for females and 13.g for males/dL or above.

If you are interested in donating blood, you can get in touch with the South African National Blood Service on 0800 119 031 or lookout for their pop up sites in public places.

"As the 2022 theme for World Blood Donor Day echoes, the selfless act of donating blood shows the human spirit and act of solidarity to care and join efforts to save lives when that need and emergency arise" said Madoda Sambatha.



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - For the next couple of days the winter's cold fingers will grab hold of the city and surrounds.

Try our homemade winter glühwein - it's great for those cold nights with friends around a fire.

The whole orange slices and orange juice help sweeten the deal while cinnamon and cloves add to the spice. You can add other spices or herbs like rosemary to your wine too. You usually want to use your favourite spicy wine like Shiraz that holds up well to heat. Serve in mugs during the night and some heat might take away some of the alcohol, you drink it relatively quickly and a lot of it, so drink responsibly.

### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 3/4 cup Orange Juice
- ¾ cup white Sugar
- 1 Cinnamon stick1 Orange
- 10 whole Cloves
- 750 ml favourite red wine Shiraz is already a bit spicy and will work wonderfully.

### **METHOD:**

- In a saucepan add the sugar, orange juice and cinnamon stick and bring to a boil, then reduce the heat and leave to simmer.
- Cut your orange in half and squeeze all the juice into the simmering liquid. Press the cloves into the outside of the orange peel and then add the peels to the liquid. Leave to simmer for around 30 minutes, until it becomes a syrup.
- Lastly pour in the bottle of red wine. Heat it until it starts steaming and then remove the clove-studded orange halves.
- For the best results this wine should be served hot in warmed mugs or glasses as cold glasses may break with the heat.

# Stormers triumphant

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Stormers are the United Rugby Championship title winners after beating the Bulls 18-13 in a riveting final in Cape Town.

The much-anticipated grand finale began at a sweltering pace. The more than 30 000 fans at DHL Stadium were treated to fireworks early on as the Bulls crossed the try line after only three minutes.

A well-controlled driving maul enabled an offload to a charging Harold Vorster who barged over two defenders to score the opening try. The home side was tentative in the initial stages, deviating from their normal attacking game plan of spreading the ball out wide to their backs. Instead they opted to take on the Bulls up front, hoping to capitalize on errors. Much of the first half was characterized by kicking for territory and hoping to capitalize on errors but the Cape side found a resolute Kurt-Lee Arendse at the back who was comfortable under the high ball.

The Bulls themselves were also not completely on top of their game and they struggled to stamp their authority on the game. Deon Fourie, playing in his 100th game for the Stormers produced a man-of-the-match performance and was able to get turnovers on several occasions and disrupt the Pretoria side's intentions. The Stormers had a good opportunity in the final minute from a line out, an attempt at a driving maul was thwarted but they earned themselves a penalty from an ensuing ruck, which was

converted by Manie Libbock to take the teams to 7-3 at the break.

The Bulls stretched their lead early in the second half with a penalty from flyhalf Chris Smith. That spurred the home team into another gear as they responded soon afterward. A Warrick Gelant grubber forced the retreating Bulls defence to dot the ball down in goal. From resultant five meter scrum, Stormers number 8 Evan Roos powered over the line to level matters. From that point on, the Stormers sustained the momentum. A free-flowing move in the 50 minute mark ended with a questionable decision from Herschel Jantjies who chose to kick instead of looking for a teammate. In the 55 minute mark, Bulls Centre, Cornal Hendricks received a yellow card for high tackle. The Stormers kicked for the line and scored thru replacement hooker Andre-Hugo Venter from the resultant lineout to make it 15-10. Smith narrowed the Bulls deficit to just two points, but Libbock came through to show nerves of steel once again to slot over a drop goal to put the game to bed with minutes left to play. The closing stages of the match were tense and nervy, as Arendse broke away in the last minute, but couldn't find a pass to release a teammate, leaving the Stormers to hang on to the 18-13 win.
