Repo rate increased by 50 basis points

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The South African Reserve Bank's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has once again increased the repo rate by 50 basis points.

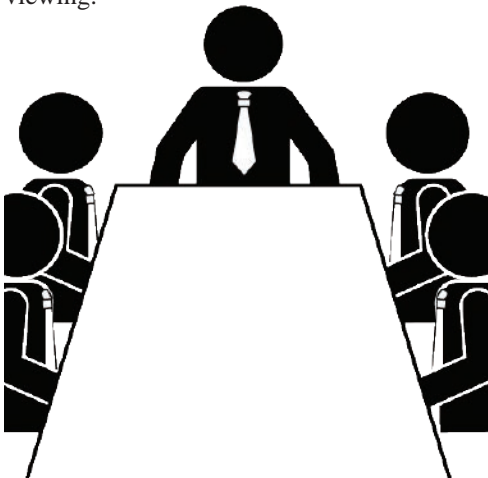
The move according to SARB Governor Lesetja Kganyago, will see repo rate increase to 4.7% per year. The increase is effective as from 20 May 2022. Addressing the media, the Governor said four members of the MPC preferred the announced increase and one member preferred a 25 basis point rise in the repo rate. This was the third consecutive increment following a two 25 basis points hike in November and in January. He said this hike was primarily due to higher food and fuel prices.

Any person claiming to offer services on behalf of the GEPF and requesting payment is committing fraud and the public is urged to report them to law enforcement agencies such as the South African Police Service (SAPS). The GEPF would like to make the public aware of the following: The GEPF services are FREE; No one is allowed to ask for a fee to assist current and former members, pensioners, beneficiaries, and their families concerning any GEPF-provided services; Take necessary precautions to protect your personal information such as identity document number and bank account details and do not share it with unauthorized persons. Eight arrested after armed robbery

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Five suspects were expected to appear before the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court on Thursday (19 May), in connection with an alleged armed robbery that was reported at a certain shop in Koster on Tuesday (16 May) at about 08:20.

According to information received from Lieutenant Colonel Amanda Funani, North West police spokesperson, it is alleged that Koster police were doing their daily patrols, when they received information of a robbery in progress at a business premises. The police reacted immediately and the victims gave a description of the get-away vehicle that was used by the suspects. This information was shared with nearby stations and units. Whilst Phokeng Highway patrol members were on patrol on the N4, at Spitskop, close to Rustenburg, the suspicious vehicle and occupants were spotted.

The vehicle was stopped by police and the five suspects, age between 32 and 52, and their vehicle were searched. Two 9mm pistols, with serial numbers filed off, were found inside the vehicle. Furthermore numerous other falsified vehicle number plates were found in the boot of the vehicle, as well as mobile phones, suspected to be robbed from the business in Koster. The suspects were immediately arrested and are charged with armed robbery, possession of suspected stolen property and possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition.

They were expected to appear in the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court on Thursday (19 May). Further information was followed up by members from Rustenburg Mounted Unit and Public Order Policing (POP), which resulted in the identification of a "safe house" in Rustenburg North, where three more suspects, aged between 21 and 43, were apprehended. A vehicle, a charcoal/grey VW Polo, believed to be used during the commission of crime, was seized. The three suspects were charged

for armed robbery and being in possession of suspected stolen property. They were expected to appear in the Koster Magistrates' Court on Thursday (19 May).

The possibility of linking them with other armed robberies will be investigated. North West Provincial Commissioner, Lieutenant General Sello Kwenza congratulated Bojanala Sub District 2 police for working together and acting fast in arresting the suspects, he said police will continue to work hard to ensure that perpetrators are brought to book.

Refusing vaccination: You can be retrenched without severance

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The Commission for Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration (CCMA) has ruled that long-standing precedents mean someone who refused a Covid-19 vaccine can be fairly retrenched without being paid any severance.

In fact, it would not be fair to expect retrenchment pay, the CCMA said.

Baroque Medical, a company that sells specialised medical products, implemented a policy of mandatory Covid-19 vaccinations. An employee refused to comply, citing "medical, personal and religious reasons". She did not substantiate the medical objection, and the CCMA rejected her personal and religious reasons. The CCMA accepted the company's basis for demanding vaccinations from staff, saying it dealt with hospitals and medical practitioners.

"Accordingly, to safeguard its own employees and ensure that the operations of the employer are not severely affected by absences as a result of staff contracting the Covid-19 virus, and that those entities and individuals that had contact with staff members of the employer are adequately protected, it embarked on a risk assessment which made it apparent that a mandatory vaccination policy had to be imposed."

The employee who refused to be vaccinated did not challenge

that policy, or the procedural fairness of her dismissal. But the process had not been substantially fair, she said, because alternatives to retrenchment were not properly considered.

Her company countered that it had considered letting her work from home, but she couldn't do her job without being at the office – and any other job in the company would still come with the requirement for vaccination.

An employee does not have to be offered a different post altogether before being retrenched, the CCMA said, but could by long-standing precedent be offered the same position under different conditions. In this case, it held, the company's operational circumstances changed. In response, it offered the employee her job with a change of conditions: she had to be vaccinated. She refused, without good reason. And that means she falls under retrenchment rules for those who unreasonably refuse alternative employment – and so are not entitled to severance pay. In the Baroque case, the CCMA said, it would be grossly unfair to expect it to pay severance.

Takealot, Pick n Pay announce online shopping partnership

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Pick n Pay has announced a commercial agreement with Takealot that will see its food, groceries, and liquor products added to the Mr D app.

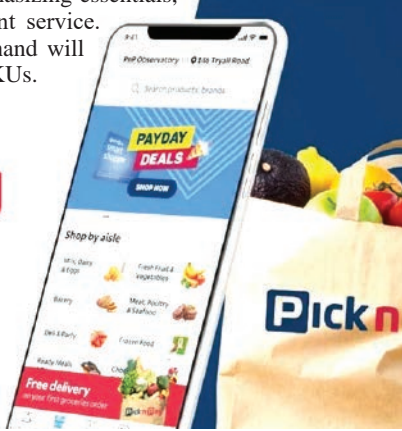
A dedicated section for Pick n Pay will be added to the Mr D app in August 2022 and will be available nationwide by the company's financial year-end. This will give Pick n Pay access to the approximately 2.5 million active customers of Mr D.

The announcement comes after Pick n Pay revealed that its on-demand grocery service, Pick n Pay 'ASAP!', grew 300% since August 2021. Pick n Pay CEO Pieter Boone explained that shoppers will have access to products offered by their local stores and will earn Smart Shopper points for their purchases. Dedicated staff will pick items in-store after customers place their orders, and Takealot's fleet will deliver them. The new feature could up the ante in the on-demand grocery delivery space in South Africa, where rival Checkers has had tremendous success with its 'Sixty60' app. The partnership was unveiled as part of a new

strategic plan during Pick n Pay's presentation of its annual results for the financial year ended 27 February 2022. The Pick n Pay Group reported what it labelled as a "resilient performance" in a year marred by civil unrest and Covid restrictions on the sale of liquor. "Group turnover increased by 5.2%, despite an estimated R2.7 billion in lost sales arising from the civil unrest in July 2021 (R1.8 billion) and the trading restrictions on liquor mainly in the first half of the year (R0.9 billion)," the company stated. The retailer plans to split its stores into two types to better distinguish between its offerings to compete across three different consumer segments. The existing brand will compete more directly with Checkers and Woolworths in the more affluent market. A new mid-way brand under the codename "Project Red" will cover consumers between the high-end and low-income market typically served by the group's Boxer stores. The Project Red stores will focus on low prices and great quality, Pick n Pay said. These stores will offer a range of roughly 8,000 stock-keeping units (SKUs), emphasizing essentials, a robust fresh offer, and excellent service. Pick n Pay stores, on the other hand will cover a range of around 18,000 SKUs.

JST hospital opens new ward to ease congestion

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The ever growing population of Bojanala District, specifically Rustenburg has had a detrimental effect on the bed capacity of the Hospital. Job Shimankana Tabane hospital is a tertiary hospital which three District Hospitals refers patients to in Bojanala District. This necessitated the expansion of bed capacity to augment limited bed space within the Obstetric department, which affected JST hospital service delivery.

The opening of a 30 bedded Ward 16 is aimed at, accelerating service delivery and enhancing the provision of quality health care for pregnant mothers. Ward 16 was renovated to suite the demands of Obstetric patients and is fully equipped with state of the art equipment same standard to those of private sector, to ensure maximum care is rendered to patients.

According to Sr Mpho Mabe, ward team leader, Ward 16 is a high risk antenatal patients ward , directly from Gateway Clinic and from Ward 4, for the management of pregnancy related conditions. On average Ward 16 admits , 7-10 patients daily for elective caesarean. Touring the facility recently, The Administrator for Health in Northwest , Jeanette Hunter indicated that it was an honour to have made a contribution to easing of space pressure for gynecological patients and staff who care for them.

“We must continue with our endeavours of creating better working environments for staff and comfort for patients”, concluded Hunter.

Ebenyo crushes field

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Kenya's Daniel Simiu Ebenyo lived up to the billing as race favourite while Uganda's Stella Chesang moved into new territory as she dragged compatriot, Jesca Chelangat to a sub 31min finish in the 2022 Absa Run Your City Cape Town 10K on Sunday 15 May.

All ingredients were in place for fast times and exhilarating racing as a fast route, near perfect weather conditions and arguably the best field ever assembled on South African soil lined up at Woodbridge Island in Milnerton for the start of the seventh annual Absa Run Your City Cape Town 10K. Clear skies greeted the 10 000 runners as they wound there way from Milnerton to the CBD of Cape Town to finish outside the Absa building at the bottom of Long Street.

As expected, defending champion, Daniel Simiu Ebenyo was aggressive from the start. In typical Ebenyo fashion, the 26-year-old took control of the race from the gun – even earlier than in 2021. Whereas in 2021, Ebenyo flew away from the field after 3km, in this year's edition, he broke away from the bunch within the first kilometre. At the 8km mark it appeared as if last year's runner-up, Isaac Kipkemboi, was beginning to close the gap. But any thoughts of a possible late charge were quickly put to bed as Ebenyo hit the final kilometre in Long Street and opened the afterburners to fly across the line in 27:34. Only Joshua Cheptegei has gone faster on South African soil with his All-Comers record of 27:16, clocked in Durban in 2018.

"Congratulations and a big thank you to everyone who participated in the race, including all the Team Absa members who joined us on Strava - Our goal is to donate R1 for every km run by Team Absa members on Strava. We look forward to the next race in Kwa-Zulu Natal and hope to see colleagues, customers and community members joining us in July," says Absa Managing Executive, Geoff Lee.

2022 Rally-Raid Championship to continue

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The 2022 South African Rally-Raid Championship got underway on a high, although not so dry, note with the Mpumalanga 400 taking place in and around a wet Dullstroom, towards the end of March.

Severe weather, and unprecedented flooding during April caused massive humanitarian devastation only three weeks before the planned #TeamHilux Sugarbelt 400, and the subsequent announcement by President Cyril Ramaphosa to declare KwaZulu-Natal a national state of disaster, forced the SA Rally-Raid Exco to postpone the event.

The flooding impacted landowners and many areas of the proposed route were impassable with the conditions not allowing for alternative routes to be identified.

Given the current circumstances and the effects of trying to reshuffle the calendar, the decision was made to cancel the 2022 #TeamHilux Sugarbelt 400 for the 2022 season. This, however, does not mean the event is lost to competitors or the area and the SA Rally-Raid Exco has assured the Beaumont Farmer's Association, landowners and involved parties of their commitment for the 2023 season.

The food donation initiative sponsored by Malalane Toyota, a member of the #TeamHilux Rally-Raid squad, that was scheduled to take place during the event, will still go ahead with 1000 learners from six schools in the Eston/Mid-Illovo area benefitting from this gesture.

"The traditional Sugarbelt 400 has a proud history and regarded by many as a true cross-country event, and we have every intention of returning to the Eston/Mid Illovo area next year," said SA Rally-Raid CEO Archie Rutherford.

The rest of the season will consist of four challenging events. Next up will be the Toyota Gazoo Racing SA (TGRSA) 1000 Desert Race which will take place over three days on 24, 25 and 26 June over a thousand kilometres in the Upington area of the Northern Cape. Competitors will just have enough time to catch their breath and recover from the testing marathon race before travelling to Bronkhorstspuit for the halfway mark event of the season on 19 and 20 August.

From there the popular Nampo 400 will be next on the calendar when teams will return to the Bothaville area in the Free State to compete on 30 September and 1 October before rounding off the season with the Parys 400 on 12 November. The SA Rally-Raid Exco, in collaboration with the landowners, are investigating the possibilities of staging the Parys 400 as a double-header on 11 and 12 November, featuring two one-day events.
