# Diesel price dropping, petrol going up, up, up



**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Although the** price of diesel is expected to go down by between R1,18 and R1,24 next week, it is still nearly R5 more expensive than a year

The price for diesel in December 2021 was in the region of R18,61 per litre. Now it will probably be approximately R24,25.

Petrol (95) is expected to increase by 55 cents per litre. This will bring the pump price to about R22,77 - R3,20 more expensive than December 2021. The price for 93 is expected to go up by the same margin and will now cost inland motorists R22,47. This is an increase of R2,92 per litre from
