BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The family of a young murder victim has been traumatised even further when they were denied the opportunity to say their final goodbye.

It is alleged that the remains of Caroline Werner (31) decomposed in a mortuary rented by the state in Tlhabane to such a state that her family were advice not to view her before her funeral.

The North West's forensic pathology services picked up Werner's body on 21 September along the R24 road between Rustenburg and Magaliesburg and took it to a funeral parlour in Tlhabane, which has been operating as a state mortuary on a contract basis since October last

Madoda Sambatha, MEC for health in the North West announced unexpectedly on 31 September 2021 that the Phokeng State Mortuary at Rustenburg - which is conveniently located right next to the police station -

would close the following morning and that the facility was being moved 12km away to the private facility in Tlhabane.

At the time, Sambatha argued in a statement, the mortuary should be temporarily closed for maintenance and that all forensic services at the mortuary would be conducted in Brits. However, the department decided to rent this particular funeral parlour's facilities for this

Twelve months later, the Phokeng state mortuary is still closed and the department has not given any updates as to when it will reopen.

EFF Councillor killed

BONUS - PHOKENG - A manhunt was launched by police here after the murder of a Ward Councillor late last week.

According to information received from Brig Sabata Mokgwabone, North West Provincial Police spokesperson, the body of 58-year-old Ward Councillor, Tsietsi Mohulatsi, was found inside his Nissan Navara bakkie at Freedom Park informal settlement between Extension 4 and 5 outside Phokeng in the early hours of Tuesday morning (4 October). He had, what appeared to be, gunshot wounds in his upper body.

Mohulatsi was a representative of the Economic Freedom Fighters.

The victim's body was spotted by passers-by who reported the incident to the police. The motive of the incident is yet to be determined and investigations are still underway.

"We have lost a dedicated force in the war for economic emancipation, and we call on all fighters in the

North West to continue to carry the baton in his honour," a spokesperson for the EFF said in reaction to the killing.
