# Eskom gets new board

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - The board of state power utility Eskom Holdings has been revamped. Mpho Makwana has been named as its new chairman, as the government searches for solutions to end a worsening energy crisis that's crippling the economy.

Eskom, which supplies more than 90% of the power used in Africa's most industrialised economy, has imposed record power cuts this year, despite a program to improve maintenance on its old and unreliable coal-fired plants. The addition of several board members with technical expertise is the latest move by President Cyril Ramaphosa's administration to desperately try and improve its performance.

Other members of the new board, which will took office on Saturday, are Busisiwe Vilakazi, Lwazi Goqwana, Clive le Roux, Leslie Mkhabela, Mteto Nyati, Fathima Gany, Ayanda Mafuleka, Tsakani Mthombeni, Claudelle von Eck, Tryphosa Ramano and Bheki Ntshahintshali.

Public Enterprises Minister Pravin Gordhan made the announcement in an online briefing on Friday (30

September).

Makwana serves on a number of other boards including as a non-executive chairman of Arcelor Mittal South Africa. Several of the new appointees have technical backgrounds, including Le Roux, Eskom's chief nuclear officer, and Goqwana, an engineer.

Rod Crompton, who served on the previous board will retain his post, as will chief executive officer Andre de Ruyter and chief financial officer Calib Cassim.

Efforts to disrupt operations, which have include sabotage, continue at the utility, said Gordhan, who expects outages to decline next week.

Ramaphosa has called for the rapid procurement of more power from privately owned plants for the past two years, but that initiative has encountered procedural and legal delays and new plants will take months if not years to be

brought online. De Ruyter has said that as much as 6 000 megawatts of capacity is needed to stabilise the system.

Most of Eskom's previous board members were appointed in December 2017. They include its Chairman Malegapuru Makgoba, a molecular immunologist, Tshepo Mongalo, a law professor, and Banothile Makhubela, who has a doctorate in chemistry.

Before Friday's announcement, the number of board members was down to just five, after several resignations.

## Man stabbed to death

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - The body of a young man was found next to a road in Kroondal.

According to police spokesperson, Sgt Ofentse Mokgadi, the body of a 22- year-old man was discovered on Sunday morning (2 October). He had a stab wound.

It alleged that the deceased was walking home in the early hours of Sunday morning from a tavern with his girlfriend when they were attacked and robbed by three unknown men.

The police are investigating the incident.

## Store robbers arrested

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - Just before closing time on Sunday night, a group of armed men entered a grocery store in Geelhout Park.

According to information, the group entered the store at around 20:00. They held up the people in the store and then proceeded to steal, among other items, cigarettes. The group then allegedly blew up the safe and stole an undisclosed amount of money before fleeing was in a Toyota Quantum, registration unknown.

At this stage, no further information is available. Shortly after the incident, police traced and arrested five suspects, with ages ranging from 28 to 44-years-old in Cashan. Items that were stolen from the shop were found inside the house. A woman who is allegedly the owner of the house, was also arrested.

The suspects are expected to appear before court on Wednesday (5 October).

The Bojanala Platinum Sub-District 2 commander, Brigadier Mamotsamai Ntoagae commend the swift response by the police.

## Rand Water concerned by increased water use

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG** - Rand Water has urged consumers to use water sparingly as high temperatures are putting a severe strain on its distribution network.

The continued high consumption may lead to serious water shortages in its areas of supply. Rand Water supplies water to parts of Gauteng, Mpumalanga, North West and the Free State Provinces. During this period, water demand always outstrips supply as some consumers do not adhere to water saving practices. Consumers are requested to adopt water savings measures. Some water saving measures include:

- Avoid washing cars with hosepipes, rather use buckets;
- Avoid watering gardens during the day, but do so between sunset and sunrise;
- Avoid washing pavements with hosepipes, but use brooms to sweep;
- Turn off taps while brushing teeth;
- Do not hesitate to repair leaking taps;
- Avoid turning on taps fully and turn them off after use;
- Avoid leaving taps running while rinsing hair or shaving;
- Use sprinkler system, if necessary between sunset and sunrise.
- Cover swimming pools to prevent quick water evaporation;
- Install low flow restrictions on taps at home;
- Use cold water to wash hands not hot water;
- Re-using bath water for watering the flower beds and lawns; and
- Use water efficient dishwashers.

On Friday (30 September) the Phokeng Police, in partnership with Royal Bafokeng Protective Services acted on information and arrested two suspects for the possession of a stolen 10 000 litre water tank. The tank was presumably stolen from a local secondary school.

The suspects, aged 20 and 29-years-old respectively, were cornered and arrested in Mosenthal village before they could sell the tank. During the arrest it was established that the 20-year-old is a current learner at the same school where the water tank was stolen.

Both suspects were expected to appear before Bafokeng Magistrate Court on Monday (3 October).

**BONUS - RUSTENBURG - The 10th edition of the Royal Bafokeng Junior NBA Finals took place at the Royal Bafokeng Sports Palace in Phokeng the past weekend.**

Twelve teams competed in six championship games for the crown of the 2022 Royal Bafokeng Junior NBA Champion in the U14, U16 and U18 categories (girls and boys). NBA Africa and the Royal Bafokeng Nation, through its sports development arm Royal Bafokeng Sports (RBS), announced an expansion of their long-term youth development partnership. The expanded partnership will see the 12th year of the Royal Bafokeng Jr. NBA Programme reach more than 20,000 boys and girls from 44 schools across the Royal Bafokeng Nation and Greater Rustenburg Region. The Royal Bafokeng Jr. NBA Programme, which launched in 2011 with 36 boys and girls teams from 18 middle and high schools across all five regions of the Royal Bafokeng Nation, has reached more than 100,000 youth over the past 12 years through basketball development and youth engagement initiatives. The programme features a youth basketball league for boys and girls in primary and high schools, elite development camps for the top 50 boys and girls in the programme, monthly clinics and camps, coaching clinics and certification programmes, and basketball court refurbishments.

“Basketball has been much more than a sport among the Bafokeng youth,” said Kgosi Leruo Molotlegi, the 36th king of the Royal Bafokeng Nation. “Through the support of the NBA and RBS, the programme has

helped develop and inspire top athletes and coaching staffs, create educational opportunities, and grow the sport not only for the RBN community, but across the continent. The RBN welcomes the continued partnership and success with the NBA.”

“Launched more than 10 years ago, the Royal Bafokeng Jr. NBA Programme was the NBA’s first youth development programme on the continent,”

said NBA Africa CEO Victor Williams. “We are excited to expand our partnership with RBS and look forward to continuing to use the transformative power of basketball to inspire more boys and girls in the North West Province in the years to come.”

The Royal Bafokeng Jr. NBA Programme is the league’s largest Jr. NBA programme in Africa and has achieved a number of milestones since its launch in 2011. More than 120 youth and 15 coaches from the programme have represented the North West Province in national tournaments; six girls and two boys went on

to represent South Africa in international tournaments at the youth and senior levels; and two girls and two coaches participated in the Jr. NBA Global Championships in Orlando, Fla., in 2018 and 2019. In addition, more than 100 former participants have gone on to study in universities and colleges in South Africa, with two alumni receiving full scholarships to high schools and universities in the United States.

In August 2017, the programme hosted the first Jr. NBA Africa Festival, which featured Jr. NBA teams from Kenya, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa and Zimbabwe competing against one another and participating in life-skills programming in the lead-up to the NBA Africa Game 2017. That same year, the programme was recognised with the Development Programme of the Year Award at the Sport Industry Awards in South Africa. The past weekend, thousands of fans in the stands had a chance to enjoy an acrobatic display from an NBA dunk team and the day concluded with a concert by South African music artists Boohle and Kamo Mphela.
