

'Woolworths prides itself on exceptionally high standards, and we go to great lengths, with very strict protocols within a rigorous food safety management process, to ensure all food we produce, package and sell is the quality our customers expect. Food safety is critically important to us, and the wellbeing of our customers is our first priority. We, along with our suppliers, proactively manage and prevent contamination of food, and through routine quality control tests we discovered a fault in a production line, which resulted in cross-contamination of milk protein between Chicken Viennas and Chicken & Cheese Viennas," the retailer said in a statement.

They are recalling Woolworths Smoked Chicken Viennas, Cocktail Chicken Viennas and Halaal Smoked Chicken Viennas with the sell by date 27 May 2023 with immediate effect. "While the cheese may not be obvious through taste or visible in the product, we are removing all the products from our shelves.



BONUS - RUSTENBURG - Five people believed to be members of a copper cable syndicate was sentenced last week.

Ernisto Siquque, Alfred Makamu, Edson Mbiza, Msindisi Mbeki and Elvis Mathabela were convicted before the Tlhabane Magistrate's court on Wednesday (17 May).

According to Captain Tlangelani Rikhotso, spokesperson for the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (Hawks), on 21 July 2022 the syndicate was found underground at Impala Platinum mine by members of Bidvest Protea Coin, with copper cable wrapped around their bodies. They were arrested by the Hawks' Serious Organised Crime Investigation and charged with tempering with essential infrastructure, theft of copper cable, trespassing and contravention of the

immigration act.

Last week they were each sentenced to five years direct imprisonment. Four accused - except for Mbeki - were additionally sentenced to twelve months imprisonment for contravention of the immigration act.

They were further all declared unfit to possess firearms.

The Provincial Head for the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation- Major General Patrick Mbotho lauded the work of all role players, including the National Prosecuting Authority for ensuring that those who damage the country's essential infrastructure, face the full might of the law.

BEWARE:

Generators can be deadly

BONUS - RUSTENBURG - With Eskom increasing loadshedding constantly, many households, as well as businesses are relying on generators to keep the lights on.

It's very important that safety measures should be a top priority as generators are the cause of injuries, as well as fatalities. Research indicates that 67% of generator-related fatalities occurred when a generator was placed in the living area of the home. 26% of fatalities occurred when a generator was used inside an attached garage or work shed.

Research also found that the majority - around 80% - of Carbon Monoxide (CO) deaths were associated with generators.

TIPS FOR THE PROPER INSTALLATION AND USE OF GENERATORS:

- Never operate a generator INSIDE your home or in other enclosed or partiallyenclosed spaces, including garages.
- A generator is a temporary power source and should never be used as a permanent solution.
- Never connect generators directly to household wiring without first installing a transfer switch. This prevents backfeeding which could be deadly.
- Make sure your generator is properly grounded and used with a Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI).
- Use only extension cords that have a three-pronged plug and are rated for the intended load.





• Your generator should be installed by a qualified electrician and bear the mark of a nationally recognized testing laboratory (SABS).

- Install battery-operated Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarms or plug-in CO alarms with a battery backup.
- Do not overload the generator.
- It is recommended that generators be positioned at least 6 metres from doors, windows, and vents to prevent Carbon Monoxide from entering the premises.
